- FIJI – ROTARY PACIFIC WATER FOR LIFE 402 (Suva East)**
Providing safe water supply and access to improved basic sanitation and hygiene for rural households and schools transforms lives, especially those of women and children. It also builds the community's resilience. In times of flooding, robust water and sanitation infrastructure reduces the risk of drinking water contamination arising from seepage from damaged facilities. During long dry spells, water stress burdens a community. Over the past 12 years, RPWFL has been responsible for the construction of over 303 projects to bring piped water supplies to rural Fijians. These projects have benefited at least 75,850 villagers.

- SAMOA – SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY 301 (Wellington/Apia)**
This Activity will establish a Science Centre for Samoa, with physical and digital exhibits, and an associated outreach programme. The Centre will spark engagement with science, technology, engineering and mathematics subjects and indigenous knowledge amongst primary school aged children, complementing the education curriculum.
ROTARY CLUB and ROTARIAN CONTRIBUTIONS WILL BE MATCHED 4 FOR 1
- TANZANIA - GIVING A FUTURE TO VULNERABLE CHILDREN AND RURAL PEASANT WOMEN 316 (Papamoa/Moshi)**
This activity "Laketatu" aims to support 140 homeless children offering them a home, vocational training and physical and emotional support in addition to supporting local women to grow vegetables and raise livestock to provide them with income to improve their wellbeing and quality of life.
- TANZANIA - PROJECT CHEF (Clothe, House, Educate, Feed) 309 (Milford)**
The creation of the Rotary Upendo Leprosy Victims' Rehabilitation and Self-Reliance Centre was in 1995 The Centre continues to be a refuge for people with leprosy providing essential medical support to the residents. A large vegetable garden, the rearing of in-calf heifers, chickens and pigs provides essential food and income for long-term sustainability.
- TONGA – CHILDREN WITH ACUTE DISABILITIES 004 (Riccartoni/Nuku'alofa)**
The disabled are very much neglected in Tonga and receive no financial support. Many families with severely disabled members live in deplorable conditions. Mango Tree Centre which supports 1,000 disabled people is giving dignity to those that are most vulnerable. This activity is to provide adequate housing for people with disabilities.
- TONGA – IMPROVING HEALTH CARE STANDARDS 428 (Whanganui North/Nuku'alofa)**
This activity is to upgrade an operating theatre at Vaiola Hospital to best practice standards and improve surgical outcomes for the Tongan community.
- TANZANIA - JOBOORTUNITY 315 (Papanui/Usa River)**
This activity supports youth from vulnerable and challenging backgrounds in Meru District, Arusha Region by creating professional and employable staff. Through the Hi5 – 21st Century Skills Training, youth are given an opportunity to a better life. The Program affects the lives of participating youth in the best way possible as it enables them to secure decent employment in companies, feel professionally fulfilled in their working environment and live balanced and meaningful lives.
- UGANDA – ABANDONED CHILDREN 426 (Whakatu)**
This activity financially supports orphan children at Luwero Community Primary and Secondary Schools at the same time connecting kiwi kids to the Ugandan children to plant seeds of hope via education, letter writing, sustainability, sport, dance & shared passions.
- PACIFIC - REPURPOSING EQUIPMENT AKA DONATIONS IN KIND 304 (Multi District/Clubs)**
New Zealand schools with changing teaching methods have thousands of desks available. Support the cost of Freight to enable this valuable resource to be delivered as well as hospital furniture and consumables together with other essential items requested by Rotary Clubs across Pacific countries. Containers packed by Rotarians in Napier, Rotorua and Christchurch.
- PACIFIC – ROTARY EMERGENCY RESPONSE KITS (ERKs) 308 (Multi District/Clubs)**
For over forty years, Rotary NZ has provided relief to families and communities affected by sudden emergencies by providing essential supplies in times of need, particularly in the after-effects of cyclones, floods, tsunamis and earthquakes. The response has always relied on the generosity and volunteerism of New Zealand Rotarians and communities. Supplies are pre-positioned in Vanuatu, Cook Islands, Samoa, Tonga, Fiji and Auckland.
