

César was raised in Mayagüez, Puerto Rico where he graduated from the Jose De Diego high school in 1972.

César obtained an undergraduate Degree of Arts in English from the Colegio de Agricultura y Artes Mecánicas de Mayagüez, Puerto Rico in 1977 and a graduate Degree of Science in Occupational Technology from the University of Houston, Texas in 1999.

In 1978 César was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the U.S. Army. He attended the U.S. Army Armor Basic Officer Course and the U.S. Army Airborne Jump School. During his four years as an active Army officer, he served as a Cavalry Platoon Leader, Scout Platoon Leader, and Executive Officer with the First Cavalry Division in Fort Hood, Texas. While stationed in Fort Knox, Kentucky, César was assigned as a Project Test Officer for the U.S. Army Armor & Engineer Board where he analyzed data in the study of the M1 Abrams Main Battle Tank survivability in battlefield engagements. He received the Army Achievement Medal for his work. Due to medical reasons he was retired as an Army Captain in 1982.

In 1985 he started teaching computer programming and implementing Local Area Network laboratories in K-12 schools with Compu*Tec Servicios Educativos, Inc. in Caguas, Puerto Rico. He also instructed school faculty and administrators in the use of computer networks in their classrooms and administrative offices.

César moved to Sweetwater, Texas in 1989 and started teaching computer courses. During his eighteen years as an Associate Professor, César taught computer courses and, directed the development, design, and implementation of a computer network department. As the Computer Division Chair he implemented specialized training by partnering with Microsoft's IT Academy and Academic Alliance Program, CompTIA's E2C Academic Program, Cisco Academy and, facilitated IT certification testing by establishing a Prometrics VUE Testing Center on the campus.
