### **Event Goals**

- Raise awareness about polio eradication
- Encourage community and family participation
- Create a fun, low-cost, easy-to-join event
- Provide Rotary visibility and fundraising opportunities
- Focus on participation over distance or fundraising totals

### **Location Needs**

- Parking and gathering space
- Restrooms and electricity access
- Safe walking route (indoors or outdoors)
- Rain backup option if possible

### **Event Features**

- Welcome speakers and short polio education segment
- Registration/check-in to count participants
- Purple Pinkie station
- Donation station (cash, card, Venmo/Zelle)
- Educational displays and photo opportunities
- Face painting, signs, and themed activities
- T-shirts and participant badges/lanyards
- Concessions/snacks and water stations

### **Walk Setup**

- Clearly marked start and finish
- Optional milestone/history signs along route
- Participant giveaway at finish line

### **Volunteer Needs**

- Setup and cleanup crews
- Registration and food volunteers
- Photographers
- Speakers and community leaders
- Medical/polio awareness representatives
