PDG Ken Mugisha - Rotary International President Representative



Past District Governor (PDG) Kenneth Mugisha is a distinguished Rotarian with 29 years of dedicated service having joined Rotary in 1996. A member of the Rotary Club of Muyenga, he has held numerous leadership roles within the Rotary community, contributing significantly at both the club and district levels. His commitment to Rotary's ideals and his extensive experience in leadership, project

management, and fundraising make him a respected figure within the organisation.

PDG Mugisha has been at the forefront of Rotary's global initiatives, notably in fundraising, for The Rotary Foundation, leading significant service projects. His most recent involvement includes a \$1.2 million malaria grant project in partnership with Rotary International, World Vision, and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. His contributions have been pivotal in advancing Rotary's mission to promote peace, prevent and treat disease, and protect the environment.

PDG Mugisha has received numerous citations for his service, with an example being Best District Governor in Africa (2017/18) for exceptional leadership and district performance. This included the Rotary 'Mission Green' initiative in Uganda and Tanzania, which aimed to plant 5 million trees annually from 2017-2022.

As Champion of the Rotary Dancing Fellowship, PDG Mugisha will be one to watch on the dance floor!

Growing up in the small town of Walla Walla in the 1960s and 70s, Andrew Kotzur's early years were shaped by strong family values and a close-knit rural community. He attended Walla Walla Public School and later St Paul's College, lauing the foundation for a future deeply connected to regional Australia.

At just 16, Andrew was selected by the Albury Rotary Club to participate in an overseas exchange program, spending 12 months in Eureka, USA. This experience proved to be transformational, broadening his perspective, building confidence, and creating the beginnings of a lifelong global network. Upon returning home, Andrew completed high school and faced an important decision—what path to take next.

After much consideration, he chose to join the family business, Modern Engineering and Construction, which at the time employed around 15 people. Determined to gain hands-on experience, Andrew worked across all areas of the business, from welding and truck driving to assembling and installing equipment.

While working full-time, Andrew completed a mature-age apprenticeship in boiler making and studied parttime for a degree in Business Administration at what is now Charles Sturt University. His design and engineering knowledge grew through hands-on experience and mentorship from industry experts. In 1987, Andrew married his wife Michelle, who has been a constant source of support throughout his journey. Together, they built a life in Walla Walla and raised their two children, Ben and Jessica.

As the business evolved, so too did its capabilities. The drive for automation and technology led to improvements in both product quality and manufacturing processes. In 1989, the family acquired a silo and water tank business in Newcastle, which marked a turning point. This expansion enabled the company to move beyond transportable silos and into large-scale, on-site constructed storage solutions. Recognising the need for innovation, Andrew led a complete redesign of the silo range between 1992 and 1998, much of it done by hand on a drawing board.

The late 1990s and early 2000s saw Kotzur transition into large-scale project work, integrating silos with advanced conveyor systems. In 2009, an opportunity arose to acquire Downfields Engineering in Toowoomba, a key supplier of conveyor equipment. This acquisition established Kotzur's Queensland footprint and expanded its capabilities, further strengthening its position in the industry.

Today, the Kotzur Group has grown significantly, employing over 200 people across its factories and offices, along with construction teams working across the country. With manufacturing facilities in Walla Walla and Toowoomba, and an office in Perth, Kotzur now operates in all states of Australia. While grain storage remains at the core of the business, Kotzur also provides solutions for mining, feed and food manufacturing, and industrial applications.

Despite the challenges facing Australian manufacturing, Kotzur remains committed to maintaining strong local production. At the same time, the company is expanding into the Indian sub-continent, exploring manufacturing opportunities to support the growing need for quality grain storage in India and beyond.



Andrew's journey from a small-town apprentice to the Managing Director of a national manufacturing company reflects a commitment to innovation, resilience, and a passion for Australian industru.



Dr Graham Sattler

Graham began his career as an orchestral trombonist, became a singer specialising in opera and music theatre, a conductor and artistic director, then commenced research in the field of community music activity and musical inclusion. He holds a Diploma of Operatic Art and Music Theatre, a Master of Performance (Conducting), PhD in Music Education and a Graduate Certificate in the Psychology of Risk.

Regularly presenting at international Music Education conferences, he has carried out community-focused fieldwork in Australia, North America and Bolivia, collaborated on community music development activity with groups in and from Armenia, and designed and delivered multiple professional learning music courses for non-

specialist teachers in Australia. Graham is a Churchill Fellow and has recently returned from investigating best-practice musical inclusion and community music leadership training programs in the US, Canada, England, Ireland, Scotland, Norway, Portugal and Armenia. Graham was appointed CEO of Christchurch Symphony Orchestra in late 2021.



Mark Balla

In the decade since joining Rotary, Mark Balla has attended Rotary International Conventions in Brazil, South Korea, Canada, Germany, Australia and Singapore. He has spoken at side events at all of these about his passion project to provide dignity and safety to those in need by providing access to toilets. He has also presented at 20 Rotary District Conferences in Australia, the USA and India as well as numerous other Rotary and non-Rotary events.

Mark is past President of the Rotary Club of Box Hill Central and a past Assistant Governor District 9810 in Melbourne. He has recently completed six years on the board of the WASH Rotary Action Group and is a member of the Rotary Foundation Cadre of Technical Advisors.



Lauren Jackson AO OLY

Lauren Jackson is arguably one of Australia's top sportspeople - considered by many to be the country's greatest female basketballer in history. She was the first Australian in history to be selected as the first overall pick in an international and professional draft. She was crowned an All-Star in her first WNBA season.

Lauren has been on top for 15 years playing at the elite level. She has so many honours spanning across several leagues, including the Australian (WNBL), American (WNBA), European (EuroLeague) and Asian (WKBL) Women's Basketball.

In 2012, Lauren had the great honour of being flag bearer for Australia at the London Olympics and in 2021, she was inducted into the Naismith Hall of Fame in 2021, the sports' most prestigious award.

Lauren returned to the sport after a 5 year hiatus, playing for the Albury Bandits in the NBL1. Shortly after, she fulfilled a dream by becoming an Opal once again, representing Australia at the 2022 FIBA World Championships in Sydney.

She was instrumental at these games in helping the Opals to a Bronze Medal win and at the 2024 Paris Olympics, become a 5-time Olympic medallist helping the Opals take home the Bronze. Not enough representing Australia, Lauren signed with the Southside Flyers in the WNBL during the 2023/24 season where she finished a WNBL Champion. In November 2024, she was awarded The Dawn Award at the Sport Australia Hall of Fame where which recognises an individual, team or organisation who show courage and bravery and have changed sport for the better.

Away from the court, Lauren is a devoted mother to two boys – Harry & Lenny – and works at Basketball Australia as their Head of Women in Basketball and runs their She Hoops program, empowering women in sport.



Justin Clancy MP - BVSc, MVSc, MACVSc, MBA

Member for Albury Shadow Minister for Skills, TAFE and Tertiary Education.

Raised on the land in the southern Riverina, Justin continues to live on a farm outside Albury with his wife Tabitha and their children - on a property which supplies its own energy needs through renewables.

As a veterinary surgeon running his own practice in Albury-Wodonga, Justin appreciates first-hand the importance of a strong local economy to create jobs for young people and provide improved services throughout the community.

He has a strong interest in health and medical research, affordable housing and regional equity in delivery of government services and support.

Justin has a passionate belief in empowering and enabling local communities, leading him to play a role in founding the Fischer Community Leadership – a program which endeavours to grow talented leaders from within their regional communities.

As a rugby enthusiast Justin likes to get involved rather than shout from the sidelines, supporting community projects, sports, health and wellbeing initiatives, as well as participating as a member of the Legislative Assembly Committee on Investment, Industry and Regional Development Justin is motivated by the stories he hears from his constituents to seek fairness and positive outcomes that promote a sense of wellbeing, making our regional communities great places to live and to do business.



Mr David Morgan

Mr David J Morgan is a Melbourne-based Specialist Plastic Surgeon.

He is currently the Head of the Faciomaxillary Surgery Unit at The Alfred Hospital in Melbourne and is involved in all aspects of the management of acute facial trauma. He also runs a private practice performing skin cancer management and cosmetic surgery of the breast, body, and face.

Mr Morgan is the newly-elected President of the Australian Society of Plastic Surgeons (ASPS), and is Chairman of their Advocacy

and External Relations Committee, and the Cosmetic Surgery Subcommittee. He has recently been appointed to the Board of Directors of Interplast, and remains an active volunteer for the organization which provides volunteer plastic surgery services to the Pacific and South East Asia. He has served as the country-coordinator for Tonga for many years.

He has previously been the National Chairman of the Board of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, the body that oversees the training of future Plastic Surgeons across Australia, and led an overhaul of the plastic surgery curriculum and training program.

Mr Morgan is a member of the Australian Society of Plastic Surgeons (ASPS), the Australasian Society of Aesthetic Plastic Surgeons (ASAPS), and is an International Member of the American Society of Plastic Surgeons.



Robii and PDG Dave Harmon

Dave & Robii married in 1984, have 2 children and 3 grandchildren. They both work in the education sector having spent most of their working life in Coffs Harbour NSW, and are committed to community service.

After moving to Ballina, Dave and Robii joined the Rotary Club of Ballina-on-Richmond in 2014. In 2019 as President of the club, Dave began a club transformation exercise. His club needed to find its relevance and identity. This transformation has resulted in a 165% increase in club membership over the past 6 years.

Ballina-on-Richmond's Domestic & Family Violence project has been a game changer for their club with Dave being instrumental in forming many partnerships at a local, state, national and international level

In 2023 – 24 Dave was the District Governor for District 9640. This opportunity enabled Dave to share his club's Domestic and Family Violence Campaign with his 19 fellow Governors of Zone 8 and received unanimous endorsement from them to take the campaign throughout the Zone across 16 countries for the next 3 years.

Dave and Robii are multiple Paul Harris Fellow recipients.



Steve Bowen OAM

Steve Bowen is the Managing Director of Bowen's Entertainment and is a professional MC, DJ entertainer and Wedding Coach. Steve was inducted into the Albury/Wodonga Business 'Hall of Fame' in 2021 and has been inducted into the DJAA 'Hall of Fame' as a founding member and former Chairperson of the DJ Alliance Australasia Inc.

Steve is a Firefighter and President of the Glenellen Fire Brigade. Steve was honoured with an Order of Australia (OAM) medal in 2022 for his dedication and community work within the Albury Wodonga Region.



Leila McDougall

Leila McDougall is a renowned entrepreneur, filmmaker and influential advocate for women in agriculture, who passionately promotes and celebrates farming life. Originally from a sheep farm in Walcha, NSW, Leila's career has evolved from fashion designer to rural teacher, and now to a filmmaker.

A decade ago, Leila founded the nonprofit organisation Live Rural, which supports the health and well-being of farmers. Her leadership and advocacy earned her a place on the Young Farmers Advisory Council and the 2014 Emerging Leader in Agriculture award. Leila's commitment to the agricultural community is further highlighted in her latest venture, the feature film "Just a Farmer," released nationally in March 2024.

Leila not only conceived and penned the script amidst the challenges of COVID-19 then went on to co-star in the film and being the executive producer. Leila aims to use the film as a medium to shine a light on farming in Australia along with supporting and uplifting rural communities.

Leila continues to be a powerful mentor and role model, championing the cause of mental health in the agricultural sector and encouraging the next generation of female leaders. Her work embodies a deep-rooted passion for her community and a commitment to using her diverse talents to effect real change.
