# Open to High School Juniors and Seniors

### Essay Theme

"Create Hope in the World: How can Communities, Schools, Families, and or Friends

support mental health with Caring, giving, and compassion?"

### 1. Establish Club Contact and Your Local Prizes

Have a discussion to determine local prizes, and who will administer the contest for your club. Put that person in contact with **Kate Farrell Kurosky**.

### The Club deadline is February 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2024

### The District deadline is March 1st, 2024

As a minimum, it is suggested that you offer a first prize of \$50 for your local winner. The club is free to offer a larger prize, as well as additional local prizes.

### 2. Plan and Promote the Contest

Involve the school administrator and reach out to the English and/or other content area teachers who align with the theme of the essay.

Request the school's assistance in distributing student guidelines for the contest.

Advertise the contest in the local papers.

### 3. Utilize the Poster

The poster is a template for your club to customize to meet your needs. Enlist the assistance of your school contacts to distribute the posters and advertise the contest to students.

4. Communicate with other clubs if they service the same high school Be sure to coordinate with those clubs to combine your efforts.

- 5. Be sure to follow up with your school contacts after a few weeks Thank them and invite them to Rotary, if possible!
- 6. Organize your local committee and plan to evaluate essays between February 3<sup>rd</sup>-29<sup>th</sup>.

- 8. Judging will be done by a group of Rotarians based on content and readability.
