Ukraine Relief

## "At Rotary, we are deeply concerned by the ongoing loss of life and humanitarian hardship caused by the war in Ukraine. We are using our deep networks and decades of experience to take meaningful action in the region."

Rotary Statement on Ukraine Crisis, March 6, 2024

In the summer of 2022, PDG Mary Ellen Bentler briefed the district concerning a Disaster Relief Fund grant that the district had collaborated on with Rotary District 2232 in Ukraine and included a District in Northeastern Pennsylvania, three New Jersey Districts (representing the entire State of New Jersey) and one in southern New York State. Past District Governor Mary Ellen Bentler and NJ Past District Governor Ray Freaney spearheaded the effort along with the support of the districts and their leadership.

These five Rotary Districts in our region combined to send a Rotary International Disaster Relief Fund grant of \$125,000 to Ukraine. This Grant will be administered in partnership with Rotarians in Kyiv, Ukraine capital. It provides humanitarian assistance to a medical shelter by supplying beds, mattresses, blankets, linens and pillows and other necessary items.

Although the Rotary International Ukraine Response Fund is now closed, we can continue to offer support through District support and Global Grants.

In the fall of 2022 David Palmer was presenting a PolioPlus Society pin at the Plains Rotary Club, when he became aware of an effort by the Plains Rotary Club to directly support the Warsaw City Poland Rotary with a massive effort of aiding Ukrainian refugees in Poland and Ukrainian Displaced Persons in Ukraine proper. Having a past connection with Ukraine and as the new Rotary District 7410 International Service Chair, David went back to his New Milford Area Rotary with a mission. His club immediately sent \$ 3,920 to the Warsaw City Rotary Club to support this effort.

A briefing provided by the Warsaw City Rotary Club (an updated version is currently on the District 7410 website) was presented at the District Conference in November 2022 and the district wide effort to raise funds was off and running, since then the district has raised over \$13,700 in donations to send to the Warsaw City Poland Rotary Club through a protocol approved by the District Governor and Treasurer. This includes the most recent effort with the annual District Hockey Fundraiser collaboration with the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre Penguins in raising another \$1,500 plus for this effort. Another spin off, of this briefing at the 2022 District Conference was a Global Grant in collaboration with Rotary Districts and Clubs in Italy, Germany, Poland, Canada, Australia, Germany, United Kingdom, and the United States. Rotary District 7410 and five of its clubs contributed \$28,100 toward this total \$183,000 effort in the summer of 2023. These five clubs are Dallas, Stroudsburg, Hazelton, Wyalusing, and New Milford Area. An update on the progress of this effort is on the district website.

Since September 2023, the funds assigned have been credited on the dedicated Rotary International Global Grant account. The manufacture and purchase of the seven water purification units started shortly after that. The units are currently being manufactured in Italy and should be ready soon to be shipped to Warsaw first and then to their destination of Zaporizhzhia in Ukraine, where they are expected to improve the quality of life of many suffering people.

Ukrainians, (including Rotarians like us) continue to suffer in Ukraine. This suffering is an existential threat to peace and stability of the entire world, and we as Rotarians must press on with our efforts, much as we have with PolioPlus for the past thirty pus years.

Our recent efforts include providing ambulances and critical lifesaving medical supplies to Ukraine in collaboration with the Saint Vladimir Ukrainian Catholic Church in Scranton. This effort is led by the Scranton Rotary Club and sister Rotary Club in the Netherlands. It will involve transporting some donated used ambulances from the United States. The ambulances are free but getting them to Ukraine may cost some money. Additionally, it is envisioned that the ambulances will be loaded with or accompanied by medical supplies to the largest extent possible. These supplies will mimic those being requested by Rotary District 2232 in Ukraine, which is currently articulated on the <u>myrotary.org</u> website.

In addition to the continued steady state efforts at fundraising, the Scranton Rotary and the District 7410 International Service Committee are planning a fund-raising dinner at Saint Vladimirs Ukrainian Catholic Church in Scranton on September 29, 2024. This dinner will feature ethnic Ukrainian foods that will provide a spiritual connection to our neighbors in Ukraine, and attendance by a number of Ukrainian military members receiving medical and rehabilitation care in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Mark your calendar. September 29th, 2024, Saint Vladimirs Ukrainian Catholic Church! More to follow.

## Tunkhannock Rotary Supports Wyoming County Drug Take Back

Tunkhannock Rotary, who has been providing Service Above Self to Tunkhannock for almost 99 years, in collaboration with the Wyoming County District Attorney's (DA) Office, has been actively involved in community outreach and advertising for the semi-annual Drug Take Back Program since 2014.

The DTB Program has been undertaken by the DA's office since 2010 to get unused and expired drugs out of people's medicine cabinets since 80% of new drug abusers got their first drugs from a home medicine cabinet or a friend's. In addition, 80% of American home medicine cabinets contain at least 1 dangerous prescription drug and "One pill can kill".

As seen below, the DTB program has resulted in over 2 tons of drugs being removed from circulation in Wyoming County and has potentially saved lives in the process. The next Drug Take Back event in Wyoming County will take place on Sat. Apr 27 from 10 AM to 2 PM at local pharmacies.
