#### **Another Successful RYLA!**

This year marks the 9th anniversary District 7410 hosted RYLA at Keystone College in LaPlume, PA.

This year, 74 young leaders gathered to participate in active learning to better themselves and their communities.

RYLA 2019 (Rotary Youth Leadership Awards) was held the week of June  $23^{rd} - 27^{th}$  and was led by Executive Chairs Amy Leiser and Karen DeMatteo, both of the Rotary Club of the Stroudsburgs. Together, Amy and Karen oversaw twenty-one staff members in addition to the RYLA conferees.

The 5-day conference featured days packed with activities. From breakfast at 7:45 am each morning to lights out at 11:00 pm, the conferees and staff stayed busy. Throughout the week, RYLA conferees learned about Rotary and how to embrace the 4-way test.

They worked on group assignments, participated in Rise Against Hunger food packaging service project, and listened to motivational speakers.

Ice-breakers were run by the staff to get help break conferees out of their comfort zones, and numerous activities taught the participants how to respect other's opinions, to work in teams, and to develop their own confidence and self-worth. Even the talent show was a milestone for some who had never performed in front of a crowd before!

Interestingly, all of the activities were fun and the participants might not have realized at the time that they were learning leadership skills until after the conference was over and they took time to reflect back on their experience at RYLA.

Never in the same group of people, the conferees were strategically divided up with each activity to ensure everyone met someone new each day. Friendships were formed, lessons were learned, and pride in oneself was developed.

# **Rotarians Donate Ballistic Shield to Dallas Borough Police Department**

At a recent meeting of the Dallas Borough Council, a presentation was made by Rotarian Ted Horn, owner and supervisor of Disque Funeral Home in Dallas, to Dallas Borough Police Department Chief James Drury. The hand-carried, light-weight personal Pop Ballistic Shield can be quickly deployed and positioned in front of the officer to protect him or her from incoming gunfire. The large bullet-proof surface area is folded for easy storage in the police cruiser, but can be popped open quickly with one hand. It can also be used to protect civilians in the event of an incident. Ted and his wife, Rotarian Janice Horn, were pleased to be able to donate

this life-saving device to the police department with the hope that the officers will never find themselves in a position where they have to use it.

For your convenience, the Drop the Drugs van is scheduled for 12noon-4:00PM.



#### **Dessin Animal Shelter**

On Tuesday July 23rd we had a visit from the Dessin Animal Shelter.

Representing them was Board Co-Chair Lisa Weber and Humane Office Marlene Metzger.

Accompanying them was Ransom, a trained therapy dog who assists in a variety of ways in our area.

We learned so much about how the Dessin Animal Shelter helps animals in our community and how they help people in our community, too! They are affiliated with the thrift shop "The Cat's Pajamas" in Honesdale and the proceeds from the thrift shop come right back to the animal shelter. Also, the animal

shelter works with organizations (such as VIP, for example) to help the pets of those who are in a crisis situation.

All pets adopted from Dessin are sterilized, micro chipped (they register the microchips, too!), and vaccinated prior to leaving the shelter upon adoption. Our members collectively gathered items to donate such as dog food, cat food, cat litter, etc. Because they are funded over 99% from donations, they graciously accept monetary donations and donations of all animal-related items (food, bedding, litter, towels, sheets, collars, leashes, etc). If you're unable to donate animal items, and a monetary donation isn't an option for you, donating some old clothes and shoes or any thrift-able item to The Cat's Pajamas is a great way we as a community can help out!

## Takes Action At Annual Mid-Summer Fair

July 7th, 2019 opened with an early rise for many New Milford Area Rotary Club members as they readied for the 8th Annual Mid-Summer Fair at Green Gables Restaurant in New Milford, Pennsylvania. Whether barbecuing 600 chicken halves, moving tables and chairs, erecting bazaar tables, serving 600 meals, or organizing placement of vendors booths, these Rotarians manifested the "People of Action" motto. After months of planning and preparation; at the end of the day, they had facilitated the sale of 600 chicken dinners, raised \$108.25 in donations for "End Polio Now" and supported nine area youth groups with matching grants that day in the amount of \$1,859!

It typically raises approximately \$6,000 each year to be shared by the Men's Club and the Rotary Club. Each supports numerous youth centric education and literacy programs throughout Susquehanna County, including United Way, Scouting, 4-H and RYLA.




