## Rotary Book Project Benefits Area Children

Children in libraries and childcare centers in the Wyalusing area were the recipients of more than 200 donated books as part of a \$3,000 project by the Wyalusing Area Rotary Club distributed the books to the Wyalusing Children's Center, Laceyville Public Library, Wyalusing Public Library, and T-Town Child Care in Terrytown on Thursday. January 4th. These books were selected by these organizations in collaboration with the Wyalusing Area Rotary Club.

The books are age appropriate for pre-school through teenagers, and promote Rotary ideals of service above self, leadership, understanding of our environment, promotion of peace and understanding, and building goodwill and better friendships. The Wyalusing Rotarians raised \$1,500 which was matched by a district grant of another \$1,500 from Rotary District 7410. In total Rotary was able to provide 210 books, distributed among the four centers.

In addition to the current book project, Wyalusing Rotary further supports youth in our community. Each year the club sends several students to RYLA, a youth leadership camp. Youth exchange students, both those visiting the United States and those from WAHS are sponsored by the club. Wyalusing Rotary supports the Hunters Share the Harvest by transporting ground venison from area meat processors to local food pantries. Rotary International continues to be a driving force for the worldwide eradication of polio, an activity that started in 1988.
