The new Rotary fiscal year continues to witness growth in the District 7410 PolioPlus Society. This growth points to a continued dedication to the elimination of this predominately childhood disease throughout the world. As of this date, 50 Rotarians have joined the PolioPlus Society sponsored by District 7410, since its inception in 2019. Several pinning's of new members are planned for late summer or early fall.

The PolioPlus Society is an opportunity for Rotarians and others to designate at least \$100 in donations each year to the Rotary Foundation, and specifically for the PolioPlus focus area. To date, \$5,900 in donations has been realized from this District initiative.



Chili Cook Off Recap



New Milford Area Rotary conducted its open to the public meeting on January 17, 2024, at the Endless Mountains Health Systems (EMHS) facility, Montrose. Following a brief introduction to Rotary and the New Milford Area Rotary, the food service department at EMHS catered a lovely meal to the public and membership. 

Tunkhannock Rotary Supports Seaside Rotary Kicks4Kids Program

At the Jan 4 Rotary Meeting, the guest speaker was Rotarian Judy Walburn, who is a member of the Rotary Club of Playa del Carmen Seaside in Mexico with the audio-visual assistance of her husband, Tunkhannock Rotarian Scott Walburn. Since the Walburns spend some time each year in Mexico at Playa del Carmen, a beach town on the Yucatan Peninsula, an hour south of Cancun, Judy joined the Mexican Club, while Scott joined the Tunkhannock Club.

The Seaside Rotary has 25 members from Canada, the United States, Europe, and Mexico. Judy described some of the club's programs.

Their "Feeding the Future" Program provides a healthy and well-balanced meal three days a week for 95-100 children who attend the "Fundacion Contando con un Amigo" school in the Village of Torres de la Paz. For some children, this may be their only meal of the day.

Their Kicks4Kids Program gives sneakers to the kids in the area, since most of the children only have access to flip-flops, which are no protection against the local snakes. So far, they have distributed 770 pairs of sneakers with 160 kids getting their sneakers last year. They are trying to provide another 500 kids with sneakers in two areas, Cristo Rey and Torres de la Paz. Judy has advertised for donations on Facebook along with the other residents/guests at the resort where they stay. They try to do as many fundraisers as possible in the area, but they are a very small club.
