Satellite club membership will be counted toward the parent club's numbers. In the event that a club sponsors a newly chartered club, those members will also count toward the sponsor club.

Each club will be ranked in each category. In the event of a tie, the winner will be determined by a vote bythe following:

Recognition will be given to the club with the highest ranking in each of the three categories. The Membership Cup winner, will have the club's name engraved on the trophy, which will remain with that club for the following Rotary year. The award will be presented at the District Conference.

In the next year, the cup will be returned to the District Membership Chair (two weeks before the next conference). This will allow for the next winner to have their club's name engraved on the trophy.


