February is Peace and Conflict Resolution Month

We have an important date in our Rotary calendar each February – **Rotary World Peace Day** is observed on **23 February**. It marks the anniversary of the founding of Rotary International in 1905, 120 years ago! This day celebrates Rotary's commitment to promoting peace and resolving conflicts globally.

Rotary has long been involved in peace-building efforts through initiatives including our **Rotary Peace Followships.** Each year, Rotary awards fully funded fellowships to peace and development leaders from around the world to study at one of our Rotary Peace Centers. Dedicated peace and development professionals from communities around the world can **apply for a Rotary Peace Fellowship until 15 May 2025**. Peace Pole Project

One of my goals under the Rotary Action Plan to Increase our Impact is to install Peace Poles in local communities. Last year, I asked incoming Club Presidents to consider this, and four immediately agreed. I'm delighted that more clubs and members are now embracing this initiative.

This year, we have installed Peace Poles in Lismore (Summerland Sunrise) and Southport (Broadwater-Southport), and we have plans for Hope Island, Goondiwindi, Ballina, Kingscliff and Griffith University Gold Coast Campus. The Griffith University project is a special collaboration between Rotary and the university as one of our first events of our District Conference weekend.

Why did I choose this goal? It's an easy project that fosters community connection by discussing languages for the pole and its placement, such as schools or community gardens. It also creates spaces for reconnection and reflection.

In the words of our Past RI President R. Gordan R. McInally...."Rotary helps create the conditions for peace, opportunity, and a future worth living". "By continuing what we do best, by remaining open and willing to change, and by keeping our focus on building peace in the world and within ourselves, Rotary helps create a more peaceful world — a more hopeful world."

We also look forward to welcoming DGE John Oomen and Narelle back at the end of this month from International Assembly 2025 to share with us the message from our President Elect of Rotary International, Mario Cesar Martins de Camargo. The Presidential message, "Unite for Good" is perfect to follow "The Magic of Rotary." Both speak to the service we provide and to the power of working together.

RYLA

Rotary Foundation

Thank you to those clubs and members that have contributed to the Foundation so far this year. For the year to 31 January 2025, across our District, contributions to the Annual Fund, Polio Plus and Other Funds totalled **USD \$60,080** (down USD \$2.2k on the same time last year).

With the AUD-USD exchange rate not doing us any favours, now is the time to make those contributions and make the Rotary Foundation our charity of choice. There are still plenty of opportunities to make an impact as over half our clubs have not yet made any contributions either directly or via club members.

Website Update

The major refresh of our District website has been completed with the primary focus being the public but with plenty of resources for clubs and members as well, including the new Club Assist pages (under the Members menu) that cover a range of topics, including –

- **Annual Governance** all the information you need to know to complete your annual reporting and information update obligations.
- **Brand & Public Image** links to information on how to ensure you use the correct branding for your club and on how to promote what you do.
- **Club Legal Requirements** what you need to know about legal requirements such as constitutions and by-laws.
- **Manage Member & Club Data** how to keep data up to date in the places you are required to do including adding or removing members.
- **Risk & Insurance** all you need to know about ensuring you are covered by Rotary's Insurance policy.
- **Youth Protection** details on how your club can ensure you are meeting your obligations on youth protection.

Also linked from the Members menu is the Rotary South Pacific Specialist Hub that will connect you with specialists in a range of areas across our Zone.
