Welcome to the Magic of Rotary - District 9640



September is that turning point month that I know I look forward to. The weather starts to warm up, wildflowers bloom and streets turn purple with the delicate, falling flowers of jacarandas.

On International Peace Day (21 September), Gareth and I were honoured to join with members of the Rotary Club of Broadwater Southport, DGE John Oomen and Narelle Oomen, members of our District Foundation team, Rotary and Rotaract members, family, friends and several of our Youth Exchange Participants for the installation of a Peace Pole across the path from the Rotary Broadwater Chapel in Southport.

Thank you to the Rotary Club of Murwillumbah who have previously sponsored Peace Poles that are in two local schools – Sathya Sai Primary School and Sathya Sai College. Your continued efforts to support the students to celebrate International Peace Day events sets a positive example in your community.

As I mentioned last update, during September I had the opportunity to learn more about a program that started right here in our District — the Rotary Falls Prevention Project. Their message is clear - falls can be prevented! Simple falls prevention actions can be getting a nightlight, physical activity, good nutrition, removing trip hazards and wearing safe shoes. Beginning in 2020, this project was developed by the Rotary Club of Lismore West. It is now a multi club project with Lismore Networking and Satellite Club of Ballina Lifestyle joining Lismore West.

Each year on ANZAC Day the Rotary Club of Coomera Valley has organised the service for the local community. <u>25 September 2024</u> was the last time a service was held at the Upper Coomera site where the Cenotaph has stood since 1918. The growth of the community has sadly rendered the intersection unsafe for local traffic and so the Cenotaph will be relocated to its new home in Tallowwood Park, Rose Valley Drive Upper Coomera in time for their community Anzac Day service in 2025. The Rotary Club of Coomera Valley have been the community guardians of this Cenotaph for many years and on the day were handed the Australian flag to keep safe until it once again joins the Cenotaph in its new home.

Our always energetic Youth Exchange and ROTEX teams held our first District Alumni event for Rotary Youth Exchange participants in early September. Let me try and paint the picture – it's Friday night, Burleigh Heads Surf Club, you can hear the waves outside and as we step inside the buzz of voices of past, present and future participants and YEP host families and team members. From the 1970's to participants heading out in early 2025, everyone connected, the conversation flowed, and new friendships created.

Our Rotaract clubs bring together people ages 18 and older to exchange ideas with leaders in the community, develop leadership and professional skills, and have fun through service. Our Northern Gold Coast (SGCR) and Scenic Rim Rotaract Clubs were both chartered in 2021, and I am happy to update that we are in the process of starting a new Rotaract club using the same model as NGCR (linked with a community centre) in the Southern Gold Coast area. You will see and hear more about this in coming months. Sadly, our Rotaract Club of Burleigh Heads, chartered in July 2013, made the decision to close but thankfully many members have transitioned to other Rotaract/Rotary clubs. I wanted to take this opportunity to recognise just some of the impact our Burleigh Heads Rotaract members have created with every project completed and every dollar donated. Through social activities and events, they supported organisations and charities including The Pyjama Foundation, Beyond Blue, Angel Flight, Destiny Rescue, Leukemia Foundation, Relay for Life, Agape Outreach Centre and Open Doors.
