### SkyHydrants Fight Poverty

The overall cost of water from a SkyHydrant™ is less than 1 cent per litre over the life of the system.

This compares with 50 cents per litre for a small bottle of water bought locally.

This doesn't seem much to Australians, but in the Philippines the minimum daily wage is around \$7.

If a family buys drinking water from the supermarket that may be almost a third of someone's wage.

Low cost safe water means that more money is available for food, clothes and other necessities.

### News from DAA Conference

One of the Keynote speakers at the DAA 2018 Conference was Governor Mujiv S. Hataman of the Autonomous Region of Muslim Mindanao in the Philippines.

During his talk the Governor was able to tell us that there had been no outbreaks of gastric illnesses at any of the Marawi Crisis temporary re-settlement camps where Disaster Aid Australia SkyHydrants had been installed.

This was in contrast to other temporary re-settlement camps where there had been serious outbreaks of dysentery and cholera.

He expressed the Marawi Region's gratitude to Disaster Aid Australia, and our local partner The Balay Mindanaw Foundation who carried out the installations.

## Safe Water Bhutan 2020



This major humanitarian project is in conjunction with our local partners: The Rotary Club of Thimphu, the Bhutan Toilet Organisation, and the Bhutan Ministry of Education.

At a DAA Board meeting on the 12th May it was decided to adopt a target of achieving **Safe Drinking Water for EVERY Rural School in Bhutan.**

To meet this ambitious target we will need to raise \$400,000 over the next two and a half years.

## Help Us Deliver Aid

Recently, staff from one of our supporters, Calmar Corps, were visiting the Philippines and offered to take two SkyHydrants with them to be delivered to Cagayan de Oro on the island of Mindanao.

On the way they then 'visited' several locations including spending a few days relaxing poolside at Villa Kasadya (see photograph).

After their 'holiday' they were handed over to our Philippines' partner Balay Mindanaw who will ensure they are delivered to a location in the region around Marawi.
