Catching Up in the Philippines

In August Chief Executive Brian Ashworth, and Director Cherie Ramsay, visited the Philippines.

This was the first time DAA has been able to review its aid delivery for four years.

The visit was an opportunity to examine ' SmartAid' responses through the COVID pandemic including houses rebuilt following three major Typhoons in 2020.

Timor Leste Orphanages

Our friend, Max Bird of the Rotary Club of Kwinana, has recently travelled to Timor Leste to install a SkyHydrant as part of the clubs long standing support of the country.

The installation is a SkyHydrant GEM for the Laga Orphanage.

DAA is proud to be supporting this project along with the Rotary Club of Phillip Island and San Remo who have each donated a SkyHydrant, with both units already on their way for further orphanages.

The partners have sent another two GEM SkyHydrants' which will be installed at other orphanages by Max in the coming months.



The above photograph is one of the over 70 homes rebuilt or repaired at Barangay Batoan in Bichol.

An important event, with our local partner Balay Mindanaw, was a formal launch of our two five-year projects for the Philippines.



These projects are:

- The Bangsamoro Health and Peace Project.
- The Mindanao Safe Water Project.

The combined target of the two projects is 10 SkyHydrants a year for the next five years.

For Year One we have already surpassed the target with a total of 16 units sponsored.

The launch was attended by Regional and Local Government representatives, Rotary Clubs and the local press.

Also, during the trip, we visited four '**Safe Water for Every Child'** SkyHydrant installations, including this installation at Barangay San Isidro in Cotabato.



We were also able to participate in the consultations for a further two SkyHydrant installations.

The visit was also an opportunity to plan our aid activities in the Philippines for the future.

Congratulations to David Langworthy OAM



David Langworthy, founding chair of both Disaster Aid Australia, and Disaster Aid International, was recognised in the 2022 Queens Birthday Honours.

David has been awarded a Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) for his services to the community over a range of roles.

David has also been a Rotarian since 1982 initially with the Rotary Club of Endeavour Hills, now the Rotary Club of Greater Dandenong and Endeavour Hills.

Rio Blanco Water Project

We recently received an update of the Rio Blanco Water Project by Disaster Aid Canada.

This is a project we supported with a Partner Grant during the first year of the COVID Pandemic.

Following the first stage of rebuilding a dam a 50mm diameter pipeline has now been constructed to the village.

As with all our SmartAid Projects the local villagers provided the labour while the Disaster Aid support consisted of materials and technical assistance.
