As well as partnering with businesses and community groups to purchase and install public defibrillators accessible 24/7. At the start 4 years ago, it is estimated there could have been around 14 defibrillators in the area, all inside Drs surgeries, clubs or businesses and when asked some could not find them. Currently there are 37 with more to come, 9 of which are available 24/7 and 8 have been provided by Yamba Rotary and our partners. This project also includes public education with Street signage and Posters indicating locations as well as a full list being supplied to Police and posted on Facebook etc. 		

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Public Seats, over 30 years ago Yamba Rotary started installing seats in public places next to footpaths on popular walking routes and other locations following requests from the public and council. ▪ Walking Track, again in the early days of Yamba Rotary a walking track was established by the members from the marina to the lighthouse on Pilot Hill. This has been upgraded by council to a concrete path with Government Grants. We are currently in the process of weeding, replanting and renovating the steps leading to the Lighthouse. Investigations into the cost and viability of replacing the current steps with a more accessible route and long-lasting materials are in progress. ▪ BBQs in Parks, we have installed or inspired the installation of many electric BBQs in the Yamba Community. Sometimes at our expense, sometimes in conjunction with Council and sometimes just planted the seed in council's collective mind. ▪ Bus Shelter, many years ago the club built a brick bus shelter in a park where many school kids catch the bus. Last year this had to be demolished because of noise complaints from neighbour due to
