Describe the event or service in 2-3 sentences: The purpose of this project is to provide a gift of a Dictionary 4 Life (D4L) to Grade 3 youth in 12-14 Ottawa schools and youth in two homework clubs. Seven Ottawa area Rotary clubs (West-Ottawa, Nepean-Kanata, Bytown, Orleans, Ottawa South, Ottawa, Stittsville) have been and will continue to be involved in the project. It was the first year for Stittsville, the 2<sup>nd</sup> year for Orleans, Ottawa South and Ottawa and the 3<sup>rd</sup> year for Nepean Kanata, Bytown (Board approval pending) and RCWO. The two homework clubs involved are Michelle Heights in which RC Nepean-Kanata assists and Winthrop Court homework club in which RCWO assists. The Rotary Club of
- 3. How many Rotarians are needed to organize: By club, it can be done by 1 person under the direction of Linda Flynn. West Ottawa, as the lead club, decided to establish a club committee manage/oversee the entire project as it expanded from a pilot project to a city wide project currently13 members guide the project with some now taking on delegated tasks specific to the RC West Ottawa schools. to implement: Again, depends on the size of the project within the club. If a club has 1 school then likely 2-4 people can implement it. If you have 7 schools many more are required to do the presentations.
- 4. When is a good time (season or month) for this event or service? Fall presentation of the books is done in October giving the students a month to be back in school and things to settle down within the school but a full school year still ahead of them.
- 5. How much money is needed for expenses, if any? The book cost is stated Colin Bryant, founder of program and posted on official website for Dicitonary4Life currently it is £3.50 per book (\$6.22 CDN/book). Additional expenses include shipping and handling from Montreal, QC,

inside label, bookmark, and miscellaneous expenses. Ottawa area Clubs are currently asked to budget ~\$8 CDN per book. Additional reductions in the cost per book occurs when grant applications are successful (e.g. a DSG) and/or donations received.
