- c) The Parent Program which works with parents to ensure long term lasting support to the family. This program allows parents to upgrade their schooling and even supports parents when seeking post secondary education.
- d) Mapleton Teaching Kitchen which teaches families how to provide nutritious meals on a limited budget so that children go to school better able to learn.
