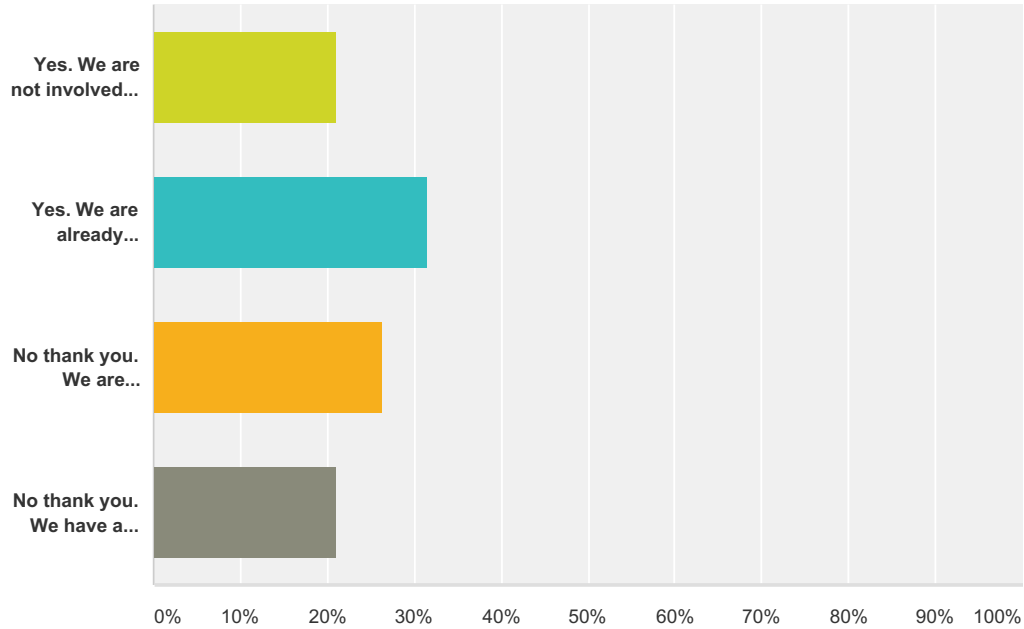

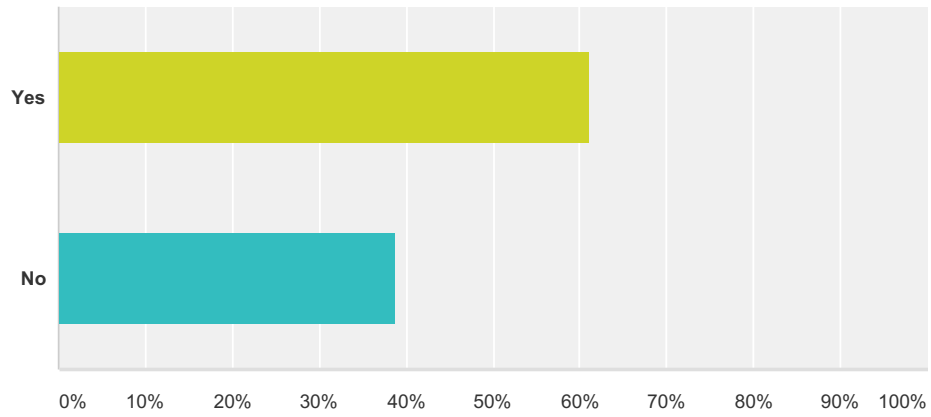

| 2  | Dolly Parton's Imagination Library. Contact Clair Ripley (clairripley@gmail.com). We partner with the Gagetown school, Dolly Parton Imagination Library, Oromocto High School and Queenstown Industries to provide every child in the Gagetown School catchment area with a free book per month from birth until aged 5. We also provide them with a bookcase upon which to store them. Cost is about \$50 USD per child annually and at start up involved about 40 volunteers (high school class built the bookcases, Queenstown Industries cut the lumber, Rotarians transported and delivered 50 bookcases, and built the second batch. | 1 | <p>Music Literacy at Tantramar Regional High School (TRHS). Dale Creelman was the principal Rotary contact; music teacher Tanya Bostick is the contact at TRHS. The Rotary Club raised funds through a pancake breakfast for the project and paired it with a bequest from a former Rotarian and a \$1,000 District Simplified Grant to contribute \$5,300 to the project. The school contributed over \$650 in cash; computer equipment and labour. The project involved converting 2 underused supply rooms into a professional-grade sound production lab and recording studio complete with sound baffling and recording/mixing equipment. Students interested in music production, sound engineering, song writing and performance now have the opportunity, in a small town, to learn their craft. The score for the school production was composed in the studio, individual musicians recorded pieces, and a composite cd of student artists was produced and mixed on-site. 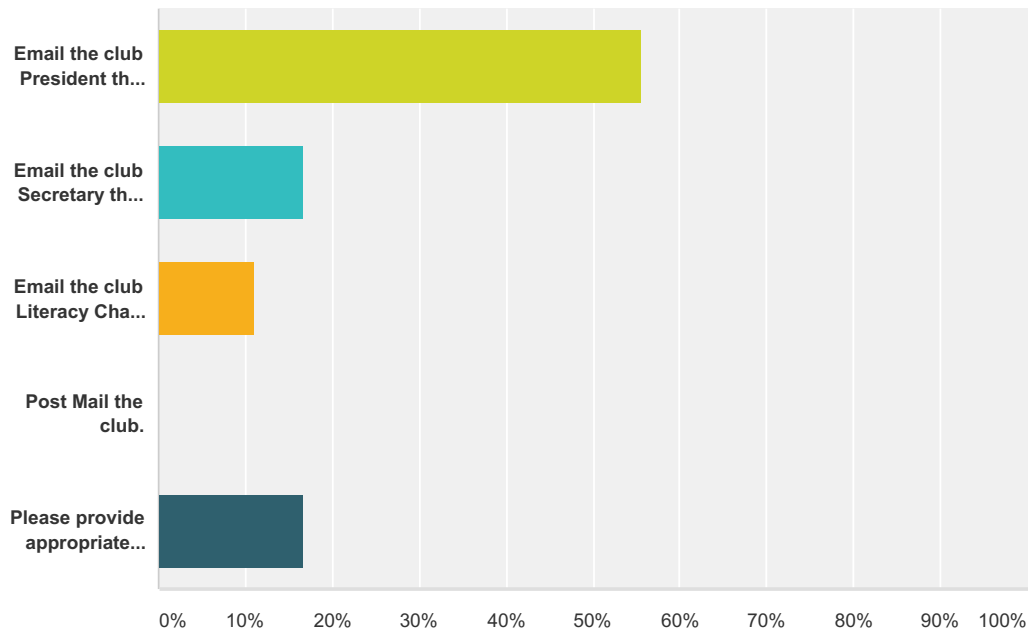
