My Fellow Rotarians,

There has been a **change** to the Marching Band and Entertainment Spectacular on Friday 28th March after Conference Chair PDG Ted Atchison met with the Hunter Stadium Management.

The **inaugural Spectacular** at the Hunter Stadium will be **post-poned** for the general public.

PDG Ted said "We wanted to start the conference off with a bang so we approached some **talented bands** and it just grew from there. We then thought this would provide a **great new event for the region**, we weren't sure how it would be received, but we went for it anyway. It soon became apparent that there was a **hunger** for a larger event of this nature of which time just did not allow for us this year."

It appears the advertising Eclipse Media, Pro Ticket and Ticketmaster had in place to sell tickets to the public has not worked.

The Hunter Stadium Management would have to outlay around \$35,000 to cover the cost of the package and be offset by preselling 5,000 entry tickets to the public.

Ted discussed this extremely important matter with me and it was obvious that involving the public in the spectacular **was not financially viable** on this occasion with a major loss predicted.

In regards to family and friends that you have already invited, they are still **welcome** to join you. Guests will pay a costrecovery fee if they require dinner and a special entry pass will be available.

I **sincerely thank** the Conference Committee for an amazing job in pulling the event together.

We will get over this difficulty and have a **great conference**. The

only sad part is that we will not be able to have a conversation with the public this time.



All the Rotarians in the group seem to be dedicated Rotarians and a number have attended most conventions over the past few years.


The challenge facing District 9670 now is to provide hosting and accommodation for this period of two weeks.




"We proudly donate proceeds to the John

#### **Rotarians Against Malaria**—


#### National Project of Rotary Australia World Community Services (RAWCS)

RAM is best known to local Rotarians through their program for distribution of **bed nets** in Papua New Guinea and the related **Adopt-A-Village Program** which has run for almost 20 years.

More than a dozen clubs from D9670 have taken part in this project.

Rotary's work has helped this nation to reduce the impact of malaria by over 70% and is continuing.

RAM has undertaken other successful anti-malaria programs in countries including the Solomon Islands

#### and Timor Leste.

Volunteer places are available for the next phase of the Timor Leste project.

In the words of Phil Dempster, National Chair of RAM:

"The Timorese project team will distribute the last 7,500 nets very late April/early May 2014. If you have volunteers who would like to accompany the team from D9650 then please forward their details Rotarians Against Malaria is a project of Rotary Australia World Community Service (RAWCS) with the project covering Australia, Papua New Guinea, the Solomon Islands and Timor Leste.

The project is focused on the prevention of mortality, and a reduction in morbidity and social and economic loss caused by malaria


