The above clubs have hosted Sophie a university graduate from England who worked in the office of a member of State Parliament. The trial has been deemed a success and a committee led by Graeme Hooper of Toronto Sunrise has now been formed to set up and promote the program further.

# **ROTARY SUPPORTING GOOD HEALTH FOR WOMEN**



Australian Rotary Health (ARH) has been contributing to important health research within our own District 9670. In the previous round of grants three researchers from the University of Newcastle were funded separately to research different health related matters.

One of the researchers, Professor Julie Byles, has been involved with The Australian Longitudinal Study on Women's Health. This major study surveys the health of three groups (based on age) of women who are interviewed every three years to track changes and emerging issues. The findings from this study provided information and direction for the National Women's Health Policy recently released by the Australian Government in December 2010.

This study found that mental health issues increasingly contributed to the burden of illness for modern women. ARH provided funding for Professor Byles and her team to examine the mental health aspects and outcomes of counselling services. This research found that access to treatments and service can vary according to women's geographical and social circumstances, and their age and lifestyle.

This work undertaken with support of Rotary helped identify some of the inequity in access to services and influence new government approaches and policy to bring about improvements. ARH is one of the major independent health research funds in Australia and is controlled by Rotarians. If your club would like to know more about ARH generally; local research projects or specific programs then members of the District's ARH Committee are available to assist. Committee members are happy to discuss opportunities either informally or at Club meetings.

# History & Heritage

# Old Dubbo Gaol

Old Dubbo Gaol is located in Macquarie Street in the centre of the City. A large collection of animatronic models tell spinechilling stories of the region's most notorious crimes. Old Dubbo Gaol gives the visitor a dramatic and realistic insight into prison life from the 1800s up until the gaol's closure in 1966. The buildings have not changed but the experience has! You will be greeted by the stern and serious Warden who will introduce you to life at Dubbo Gaol in the 19th century.

# Dundullimal

National Trust icon and Australia's oldest timber slab homestead. Built in the early 1840s as the head station of a 6,500 hectare squatting run, the homestead is Dubbo's oldest building open to the public.

# Terramungamine Grooves

Visit the site where the Tubbagah People of the Wiradjuri Nation shaped tools, leaving 150 historic rock grinding grooves on the banks of the Macquarie River at Terramungamine Reserve.

# Art & Culture

#### Shoyoen Japanese Gardens

Stroll within the tranquil surrounds of the Shoyoen Japanese Gardens & Jurian Teahouse. The horticulture and architecture of the Gardens is fully authentic, gifted to the City by our sister city in Japan – Minokamo.

# Western Plains Cultural Centre

The only place in Australia that you will see an 11 tonne Hero Wagon and surviving Sudan War Jacket alongside the intimate stories of those who have shaped the city. More than 1000 items are on permanent exhibition in its museum alone. Crossing to the western wing of the WPCC, delegates can meander through more than six exhibitions of local and national significance.

# Garling Gallery

Located just 13km from Dubbo on the Mitchell Highway in the village of Wongarbon. Local artist, Brett Garling, creates figurative sculptures cast in bronze.

# Visit Narromine

# The Narromine Aviation Museum

highlights the history of aviation in the Narromine area. Beginning more than ninety years ago with a small locally built aircraft, the story expands through the 'barnstorming' years of the 1920s and 1930s. See the locally built and operational, Wright Brothers Model A Flyer replica on display.

The **Narromine Wetlands** is a natural stormwater catchment area which has been reconstructed to act as a natural filter for incoming stormwater and providing habitat for birds, frogs and other wetland inhabitants. Its walking tracks and viewing platform were projects of the Narromine Rotary Club and Narromine Shire Council.
