

These seminars will be partly funded by District and Clubs are invited to sponsor their attending members at \$15 each. This will minimise the personal costs to our new members and as I see it a great investment in the future of Rotary.



### Supporting healthy minds, bodies and communities for over 30 years



Mental illness can affect anyone at any age and is close to becoming an invisible epidemic, affecting more than one in five Australians every year. So fast is this problem growing that depression and anxiety are expected to become the world's leading causes of disability within the next eight years.

As mental health continues to be a growing issue for Australians, so does the need for quality support systems, hospital facilities and services with knowledgeable, experienced staff. Providing the best for Australians with mental health is heavily reliant on current research funded through donations to organisations such as Australian Rotary Health who allow mental health professionals to stay informed on the most recent research findings in areas of mental health.

Australian Rotary Health is one of Australia's largest non-government funding bodies for mental illness research. Thanks to the generous support of Rotarians Australia wide over the past 31 years, Australian Rotary Health has donated over \$28 million that has facilitated better treatment and services for all Australians, in particular those who are least able to assist themselves.

This year, we have funded projects addressing the issues and causation of indigenous mental health, which is 2-3 times higher than the rest of Australia, furthered research into the effects of prenatal hormone exposure on mental health, and financed the first online therapy program to investigate the treatment of preschool children with anxiety.

By continuing to fund research that uncovers possible causes of mental illness, Australian Rotary Health brings the possibility of prevention all the more closer.

### Immediate Past District Governor's Partner's Project, 2011-12



The District Governor's Partner's Project for DG Janette Jackson's year was the raising of funds to support the Royal Institute for Deaf and Blind Children.

For more than 150 years, RIDBC has been at the forefront of educating children who are deaf or blind. It is Australia's major independent special educator providing support to affected families and the more than 1000 children who have significant hearing and/or vision impairment. It relies on donations, bequests and specific fundraising activities for its income.

Originally it was hoped to be able to raise funds sufficient to make a substantial contribution to the upgrade of the technical platform upon which RIDBC Teleschool is based, but when costings were done it was found that the amount required was in the millions of dollars – a bit out of our league. Thus we made efforts to raise funds to assist in the on-going work of the Institute – examples of which are the provision of i-pads at \$1000 each, set-up costs to enable a family to engage in Teleschool at \$7,500 per family, and \$15,000 each year to fund the costs of bringing early education and training to one child from birth to 3 years of age.

Clubs in the District have been most generous with contributions. Some have been made direct to RIDBC, other contributions have been sent to the District Treasurer for payment to RIDBC in bulk. Donations have ranged from \$62 as the proceeds of a "swear box" located on the bar of an establishment where one Club meets, to \$10,000 as part of the proceeds of a club's major annual fundraising event. A special concert at Belmont 16 Footers hosted by Toni Stevens of the Rotary Club of Morisset raised \$8112, 48. At the time of writing, the total amount raised by Rotary Clubs for donation to RIDBC exceeds \$44,900. Part of the funds has already been received by RIDBC and the balance will follow shortly. RIDBC has promised that the funds donated will be spent in the Hunter and in the area included in Rotary District 9670.

To say that I am elated with the result is somewhat of an understatement. I sincerely thank the Rotary Clubs concerned, the names of which are hereunder, and independent contributors, for their donations to this project.




