
There are many Youth Exchange Programs offered throughout the world but I believe none compare with the support given by our Rotary Network.

Rotary Foundation Future Vision

As you all know, the Rotary foundation is changing how it operates at the start of the next Rotary year. This change operation has given rise to some uncertainty about how this will affect Clubs and District programs.

The District Foundation Committee is addressing these concerns by keeping up to date with developments in this area and researching how we are going to implement any changes. The main changes the Committee are focusing on at this time are the changes to Group Study Exchange program and in the operation of the Grant structure.

Rotary Foundation Future Vision (Cont)

The message that GSE will no longer exist is not true, the change is in how it will be funded. At the District Foundation Committee meeting on Sunday 12th August GSE was one of the main topics of discussion and the Committee has taken the approach that this district will continue with traditional GSE programs providing the funding is available, which will now come from the District Grant Area. The Committee will also look towards the new Vocational Training Team exchanges which can be funded from Global Grants.

To ensure we have the funds to carry on with the Foundation's programs, including GSE, members still need to contribute to the Foundation through the Every Rotarian Every Year program and for Clubs to support the Foundation through the Annual Giving and support of the District Raffle.

The Committee at the meeting also decided to carry on with the organisation of the District Foundation Raffle this year and you will receive information on this in the near future.

I understand these changes may be confusing and I hope that this article will help to make the TRF future a little clearer. To gain more, I invite you to attend the District Foundation Seminars to be held in November, the 10th in the Hunter and the 28th in the Dubbo area.

The next meeting of the District Rotary Foundation Committee will be held on Saturday 13th October in Singleton with the main topic of discussion being the program for these Seminars which will cover the Foundations Future Vision Plan and District and Club Certification for receiving grants under the plan. More information will be forthcoming after the meeting in October. If you have any topic you believe should be covered during the Seminars pleas let the under signed know before the meeting on 13th October so it can be discussed as part of the program.
