
A top priority of our Foundation for more than a quarter of a century has been the eradication of polio.

When we started working to immunize children against polio, one thousand people contracted polio every day.

But today, thanks to your hard work, there are only a few hundred cases of polio a year! There is no more polio, anywhere, in India. India, along with all of Southeast Asia, is now certified polio-free. Polio is now endemic in only three countries: Afghanistan, Nigeria, and Pakistan. Just three!

When we eradicate polio — and we will —we'll have proved ourselves an organisation capable of great things. We'll be even better equipped for the next challenge we choose to take on. And we'll have given the world a gift that will last forever .





In Rotary, strong friendships and great service go hand in hand.

Our Rotary friendships give light to our lives, and it is Rotary friendship – as well as service – that lets us 'Light Up Rotary'.








