The **District Governor's Partner Madeleine Atkins**, celebrates the success of fellow Rotarian **Michelle Davis from the Rotary Club of Green Hills Maitland** in her award as the Maitland 2014 Woman of the Year. We recognise Michelle in this edition for her significant contribution to road safety in the local community through ROADwhyz.

"Personal Loss Drives Road Campaigner"

"A road safety advocate was revealed yesterday as the Maitland 2014 Local Women of the Year. Michelle Davis said it was an honour to receive the award for her contribution to road safety campaigns. Her two sons died in a car accident at Morpeth in 2005.

"After losing my children, I felt compelled to create awareness and educate young people on safe driving", Mrs Davis said.

Maitland MP Robyn Parker praised Mrs Davis for her work in coordinating the ROADWhyz young driver program and representing the NSW Centre for Road Safety. "Michelle is both an inspiration and made a significant contribution to the Maitland and Hunter Region communities" she said.

Mrs Davis also co-founded the Helping Other Parents Exist (or HOPE) support group in Maitland, which offers comfort to those who are trying to cope with the loss of a child.

"The recognition of this award reminds me that the work I do is making a difference" she said.

Mrs Davis has been invited to attend the NSW Women of the Year awards ceremony on March 7 at Parliament House, on the eve of International Women's Day."

Congratulations to Michelle and her team, and a huge thank you to the Maitland community for recognising Michelle in such a tangible way. Michelle will be a guest speaker on Sunday morning at the District Conference. Please join us in celebrating the work she is doing in District 9670.
