Welcome to Rotary Year 2016-2017.

By the time you are reading this, most Clubs will have completed their Changeover, and a new Board will be managing each club on behalf of its members. A successful joint changeover involving The Rotary Club of Cessnock and Rotary International District 9670 took place at Cessnock Leagues Club on 2nd July last, when Vicki Steep handed over the Club presidency to Ross Lidbury and Adrian Roach handed over the District



Governorship to Stephen Jackson. Clubs have no doubt been in planning mode for some time and it will be interesting to hear of Club objectives and goals.

### **New Format**

This edition of the District Governor's Newsletter comes in a new format. It will be shorter, and hopefully will not repeat information available elsewhere, such as on various Rotary websites. There may be references to where information about a particular thing may be found, but the actual information will not be repeated.

### **District Dues**

Part of the costs the District has to pay each year are the insurance premiums. Most members don't know much about the insurances the District carries, but the 5 policies play an important part in protecting the District and its officers, the Clubs and their members, the volunteers such as Friends of Rotary, and various committees and groups from the risk of litigation should some potential liability occur. We have to have funds available from which to pay these premiums, which are usually payable before the end of July, so I urge all members to pay their club subscriptions promptly so Clubs can pay the District Dues.

# **District Governor's Official Visits**

These visits are an important part of both the District Governor's and each Club's year. They give the District Governor the opportunity of meeting with the Club's board and discussing the club's plans. There is then a club meeting to which all members, and often their partners, are invited. But it is not a one-way street - those present have the opportunity of asking the District Governor questions relating to any aspect of administration at Rotary International and District level. The visits start late in July and run into November.

### **RI President**

The new World President is John Germ from the Rotary Club of Chattanooga, Tennessee. He has two aims for Rotary in the current year. The first is to achieve the eradication of the poliomyelitis disease from the world, and the second is to grow the membership of Rotary.

### Polio

With only 17 new cases of the wild poliomyelitis virus having been reported this calendar year, it is possible that we

are on track to eliminate it completely. But there has to be a 3-year period without any new case being reported before that claim can really be made. The campaign is still going and it will still cost a lot of money to get to the desired final result. So please keep donations to The Rotary Foundation for polio plus coming.

### Members

Rotary seems to be able to attract members, but has problems retaining them. No doubt here will be natural attrition, but if we can continue to recruit new members, and can retain our existing members, a substantial part of the problem is solved.

# The 2106-17 Rota

**New Rotary Theme** 

The 2106-17 Rotary theme is Rotary Serving Humanity. It's simple, and the closest we have come in a long time to the basic theme of Service above Self. Let us look at our club activities and projects for this year and ensure that they do demonstrate that Rotary (is) Serving Humanity.

### Attendance records.

The Rotary Rules require clubs to report their attendance to the District Governor on a monthly basis, and for some time PDG Peter Sivyer has been recording this information and the results have been published in the District Governor's Newsletter each month. When the information is received it is reviewed by the District Governor and the relevant Assistant Governor. Falling attendance may be an early warning that something is not going well within a club and enables both the District Governor and the Assistant Governor to raise the matter with the Club's board.

As far as I can see there is no need for the statistics to be published, and there is no requirement from Rotary to rank clubs in order of their percentage attendance.

I am therefore reminding clubs that an attendance report should be made to PDG Peter each month, and I am asking him to compile a report for the benefit of the District Governor, the District Governor Elect, the District Governor Nominee and the Assistant Governors.

If a club really wants its attendance figures to be published that can occur, but unless a request to do so is received, I will not in future be requiring those statistics to be published.

# Work Hours Reports.

What seems to me to be of greater importance, and to be a statistic which clubs within the District, and the District itself, can use to enhance Rotary's public image both in communities and more generally, is the number of hours of community service work carried out by club members each month.

These figures can be accumulated over specific periods and newspaper articles, other mainstream media reports and/or social media posts can be generated to advertise the result. But it need not rest there - local councils are often interested in what various clubs and organisations within their area are doing to assist the public.

Clubs having an accurate record of their figures may find they can include them in applications for funding for grants to show the funding authority that they are an active organisation capable of getting a funded project completed. There are no doubt other benefits as well.

We will have to be careful that the records we keep of community service work carried out are accurate. It is likely that opinions will vary as to what should and should not be included in the times we record. There will be

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hundreds of examples, but I mention just two where I think a basic rule needs to be adopted.

Firstly, the time spent by an organiser in working out the number of sausages, loaves of bread and cans of beverages required for a barbecue to be held at a retail store, and the time spent in locating volunteers and preparing rosters, should not be included, but setting up the equipment on site, doing what is required to prepare and sell the products, and to clean up at the end of the day, can be recorded.

Secondly, a member of a Rotary Australia World Community Service team which operates anywhere should only record the actual hours of work carried out - the time spent in getting to the site, in eating, sleeping and relaxing should not be included.

I have asked PDG Peter Sivyer to record these hours as advised by clubs. I will shortly arrange for a draft return form to be prepared which can be used by club secretaries (or whoever gets the job within the club) to report the details.

I will circulate the form in due course. However I ask that in the meantime, clubs do nominate a person to keep these records on a monthly basis with effect from 1st August so that returns can be submitted early in Each month commencing in September 2016.
