Constitutions and Bylaws for Rotary Clubs

In Volume 3 of the District Governor's Newsletter I indicated that I would shortly be sending out information about the new Standard Rotary Club Constitution and the Recommended Club By-laws.

Clubs are required by Rotary International to adopt the current Standard Rotary Club Constitution.

The 2016 version of the Standard Rotary Club Constitution and the Recommended Club Bylaws are available to download from the Rotary website.

To access the current documents, go to www.rotary.org and log in to MyRotary

with your login details, go to Learning and Reference, then to Document Center (hate the spelling!) put into the search box "Standard Rotary Club Constitution", click on it and it will come up with a number of options, the first of which is a PDF copy of the Manual of Procedure. Click on that, a line will appear at the bottom of the screen for Open or Save, click Open, and when it does, scroll down to Standard Rotary Club Constitution

which is on pages 86 - 99, and is followed by the Recommended Rotary Club Bylaws. You can print each of the documents separately.

To revoke or rescind an existing constitution and to replace it with a new constitution, a special resolution is required. This means that 21 days notice of the special resolution has to be given to members. The Department of Fair Trading has to be advised of the passing of such a special resolution within 28 days after that resolution is passed. Form A6 of the Associations Forms is required to be completed and a fee, currently \$49, is to be paid to have the changed constitution registered. I have asked the District's Research Officer to prepare a succinct statement of the steps required to effect the revocation or rescission of an existing constitution and its replacement by the new constitution. I hope this document will be available to clubs by the end of October.

Rotary's Parliament – the Council on Legislation

At the 2016 Council on Legislation, substantial changes were made to the way in which Rotarians are able to influence the laws passed by Rotary International. Previously all proposed changes had to go to the Council on Legislation, which only meets every 3 years. Now certain matters can be decided by

a new body called the Council on Resolutions. The Council on Resolutions is new for 2017-18 and will meet online each year to vote on proposed resolutions submitted by clubs, districts, the RI Board, and certain other Rotary bodies. The Council on Legislation will continue to meet in person every three years to consider enactments that amend the constitutional documents, along with position statements from the RI Board of Directors.

The Rotarians who are to represent the District for the 2017-2020 cycle on both

the Council of Legislation and the Council on Resolutions are required to be selected by 30th June 2017. This will obviously have to be done at the Resolutions Session of the District Conference to be held in Dubbo on 17-19 March, 2017.

More information about qualifications for selection as the District's representatives, about enactments proposed for consideration by the Council on Legislation, and resolutions proposed for the Council on Resolutions, will be forthcoming as it comes to hand.

Sexual Abuse Insurance Questionnaire

Thanks to those clubs which responded to the request for them to complete the

Club Insurance and Compliance Declaration. Some 36 out of the 51 clubs (including Hunter Rotaract) submitted the the working declarations. This represents a response rate of about a 70%. However it could have been higher. Nevertheless the responses have enabled the District Insurance Officer to complete the 7 page Sexual Assault Liability Insurance

Questionnaire demanded from the District and submit it to the Broker by the required date.

While the response rate is pleasing, one cannot help wondering why some clubs did not complete the declaration. I have difficulty in believing that none of them have any involvement with young people. I do not believe that the questions asked were complicated and not able to be understood. I hesitate to think that the Club Executive thought it was rubbish and unnecessary bureaucracy and therefore could not be bothered to complete it.

Two things arise from this process.

The first is that many clubs are asking for familiarisation with District Risk Management Policy and Guidelines for Youth Programs, for advice about the Rotary International Sexual Abuse/Harassment allegation reporting guidelines, and for Youth Protection Procedures Training. The District Governor, Governor Elect and Governor Nominee will be meeting very shortly to discuss ways in which this information can be provided to clubs, and in particular, to develop strategies for training people to be competent to deliver the information. The District Finance Committee will also be meeting and no doubt any recommendation from the G-train as to how to cover the costs of developing the training will need to be discussed. But the issue is a priority issue and will be addressed as soon as is possible.

The second is that absent any cogent reasons for failing to submit the declaration requested, a club which did not send it in and subsequently receives a claim alleging sexual abuse or harassment may not expect much support from District or from the other District Clubs which did comply with the request. This is not to suggest that they will be left without insurance, but any financial or other assistance they might seek from other Clubs in the District might be more limited than would otherwise be the case.

District Governor's Visits

My official visits to the District Clubs are going very well. As at the end of the week

commencing 3rd October, I had visited 37 of the 50 Rotary Clubs in the District and had also visited the Rotaract Club of the Hunter. I will be re-visiting a couple of clubs later in the year or early next year. This is because on one occasion the club's program was overly full and I did not have the opportunity of speaking to the members. The second situation



has occurred because the Club is attempting to re-invent itself and reviewing its whole structure and policies. Time is needed for any changes to take effect and

Plans for the forthcoming visit by a team from this District to Buenos Aires and the areas around that city forming District 4905 in Argentina are well underway. The purpose of this is to select the best possible team, one in which the members will work together as a Study team to represent this District and Australia, but we are also looking at those individuals who are likely to **Exchange** acquire knowledge and experience to help them in their future careers. All those selected so far are well



qualified and could represent the District well, but as they will be in close contact for a month, sometimes in stressful situations caused by crowded programs, travel, lack of sleep and changed diets, we have to be sure that they can all get along together. In many ways it is unfortunate that we can only send one team leader and 4 team members, as they would all benefit from the experience.

Some time ago GSE Chair Christine Roach sent information to our counterparts in District 4905 giving them information about this District. We have now received much more information about the extent of District 4905, and some of the areas and clubs our team will be likely to visit. The exchange promises to be an exciting time for all involved, whether they be team members or host families and host clubs.
