Our new vision statement: why should you care?

We are now more than a year into the process of revisiting Rotary's strategic plan, a process that will allow us to examine our strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats in order to move the organization in a direction that will allow Rotary to thrive in the years ahead.

You may have seen the vision statement and wondered what its relevance is to you. If Rotary were a ship approaching land, our new vision statement would be the lighthouse that keeps us from running aground. Our vision statement explains what we want to achieve, in the same way that our mission statement explains our focus, and our strategic plan represents how we are going to get there.

Strategic planning is a process, not an event. And it is certainly not limited to activity conducted in the board room.

Out of the focus groups, different elements emerged that were then tested around the world to be sure they were culturally appropriate to both a Rotarian and non-Rotarian audience. These elements became our 24-word vision statement.

"Together, we see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change — across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves."

A WINNING ROTARY

Rotary wins Hero Award for polio eradication efforts

Rotary's commitment to polio eradication won a Hero Award from the One Billion Acts of Peace Campaign, an international global citizens' movement to tackle the world's most important issues. The campaign is the initiative of the PeaceJam Foundation led by 14 Nobel Peace Prize laureates including Desmond Tutu and the Dalai Lama.

Rotary.org wins People's Voice Award from Webby

With a majority of online votes, Rotary.org took the prestigious Webby People's Voice Award in the category of association websites. The Webby Awards are the leading international honour for excellence on the internet. Rotary.org was one of five websites nominated in its category. This year, 3 million votes were cast online in the People's Voice portion of the awards. The redesigned Rotary.org is part of a number of enhancements made possible by the dues increase approved by the 2016 Council on Resolution.

ONLINE GIVING, AND WHY IT MATTERS

As more and more of our daily activities, interactions, and transactions happen on our computers and mobile phones, it makes sense that our charitable giving has started to move to the digital sphere.

Online contributions to The Rotary Foundation have increased steadily over the past five years. A total of 60,827 donors contributed \$14.7 million online to the Foundation in 2016-17, compared with 27,578 donors contributing \$8.1 million online in 2012-13.

When you exclude the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation's large, one-time donations of \$100 million from the total (large donations like these would not be made with a credit card online), Rotary's online giving falls very close to the industry average of 7.2 percent, as reported by the Blackbaud Institute for Philanthropic Impact, which publishes the annual Index of Charitable Giving.

Donors are also getting more comfortable giving on mobile devices. The rate of smartphone use in charitable transactions has nearly doubled since 2014, now accounting for 17 percent of online gifts.

Recognizing this shift, Rotary has made online giving easier. When you give to The Rotary Foundation, it takes just a few simple steps, whether you use a desktop computer or a mobile device.

The page you use to donate is available in several languages, and you can give using any of a number of currencies. It's also easy to give memorial and tribute gifts.
