



Silas's story ...

"The Rotary Program has allowed me to meet some awesome people and gain some invaluable veterinary experience in a completely new cultural setting. I have had a really great time and I would like to thank Rotary for giving me such a good opportunity - no doubt a lot of what I have learnt will come in useful when I start vet school later this year."

Silas's journey ...

Silas enjoyed the varied nature of his work placements, undertaking farm visits with vets, and experiencing life on outback stations. He has had the opportunity to prepare for surgery, bull testing, and scanning cattle for pregnancy which often involved getting up very early and driving for hours so work could start at sunrise to avoid the heat! "It's very hot out there!" Silas had exposure to a variety of veterinary cases including a cow with a "woody tongue", a bull with a foot abscess, a calf with a lump on the shoulder, a dog with an abdominal hernia, and sheep post mortems. Working on a cattle station was a real Australian outback experience for Silas where he mustered cattle on motorbike and horseback, weaned calves, worked in the yards, and "mucked" in with cleaning water troughs. An added bonus was the opportunity of equine work at Gooree Park, a renowned racehorse breeding stud.

Outside of work, Silas also enjoyed the opportunity to attend the Australian Veterinary Association (AVA) Conference in Dubbo, and the Rotary District 9670 Conference in Mudgee. Following his work placements, Silas went to work on a cattle station in Northern Australia. These experiences will greatly enhance Silas's studies when commencing his Veterinary Medicine course at the Royal Veterinary College in London, later in 2016. (2016)

Kate's journey ...

Kate's work placement was undertaken with National Parks and Wildlife Services at Hunter Wetlands, Shortland. The first of her two main projects was to plan and develop signage for a new park. The signs include entry points, trails, and information signs. Obtaining quotes for the signs to be produced was the final step. The second of her projects was to set up photo points showing how the vegetation and the landscape have changed over time. This helps to show the importance of protecting our flora and fauna; and also supports funding opportunities. An important field task was to assist the Rangers with weed spraying. Kate attended the Rotary District 9670 Conference and featured in the program to present and promote NGSE. Following the completion of her internship, Kate returned to Canada and immediately gained full time employment as a Park Warden (equivalent to a Park Ranger in Australia) at Pinery Provincial Park, in Grand Bend, Ontario. Harriet's journey ...

"An extraordinary time" – this was the buzz for Harriet, working in an MP's office in the lead up to a State election. Harriet undertook research and wrote several speeches for Greg concerned with local issues of the time, and had the opportunity to hear her own work in the NSW Parliament. Harriet wanted to put her free time to good use, so having befriended Lara, a member of Rotaract, together they organised a fundraising activity with her host Rotary Club to be able to donate \$500 to a Cambodian orphanage where Lara had worked voluntarily on several occasions, and where the children have special needs. Harriet returned home to England, undertook some short term paralegal work, and was then successful in gaining a traineeship with Allianz – one of 16 from 3,000 applicants (well done Harriet!) - to work towards her Advanced Charter in Insurance. Sarah's story ...

"Spending three months at Park House School really helped me identify the specific setting within the wide parameters of the Occupational Therapy profession in which I wish to work. The Rotary experience reiterated my passion for working with children on the autistic spectrum and with behavioural conditions, in a specialist school setting."

Sarah's journey ...

Sarah set off for the UK to undertake her internship as an Occupational Therapist at Park House School, a school for children with special educational needs, but predominantly autism, and aged 8 to 19 years — a school where all children are special, some just needing a little more help. She worked alongside teachers, a speech and language therapist, a psychologist, a paediatric occupational therapist, and a pastoral care worker. Her work involved a variety of formal and informal occupational therapy assessments; and she designed, I mplemented and monitored a variety of individualised therapy programs to include sensory integration, gross motor movement, postural control, hydrotherapy, imitation/copying, and daily living skills programs. Following a surprisingly tearful farewell to Park House School, Sarah took some time out for a European travel adventure for the next three months. Upon returning home to Newcastle in *Australia*, she was employed as a Rehabilitation Consultant with Advanced Personnel Management. Sarah has since moved to Queensland to pursue her passion for working with children and adolescents with autism and behavioural disorders. *(2015)*
