The Model United Nations Assembly (MUNA) is an initiative by Rotary to develop an understanding of World Affairs for Senior Secondary School Students in a forum similar to a General Assembly of the United Nations.

Saturday 25th May, 2019 (9am sharp—4pm)

NSW Parliament House

Rotary's objective is to develop Tolerance, International Understanding and World Peace. What better way for us here in District 9675, than to give our future leaders an opportunity to consider real issues confronting the world. We hope their experiences will influence many others in our quest for World Peace.

We invite all the Rotary Clubs of District 9675 to support this program by sponsoring **one team per Club** of up to three senior High School Students to MUNA. The steps are simple:

1. Firstly speak to the Principal of your local High School to promote the concept.
2. Then seek the name of the year 11 Co-ordinator for 2019 who will nominate a teacher to promote the concept to the Year 11 students for 2019.
3. Once the school has selected a team complete a nomination form which can be downloaded from the District website and send it and the sponsorship fees to the District MUNA Committee. **Applications close on Friday 10th May 2019**

Offer any assistance to the students as they prepare for MUNA.

You may even invite them to a club meeting or offer to provide transport to MUNA.

Suggest that current Year 10 students come and watch an Assembly so that they are better prepared for the following year.

Some clubs contact several local schools and have a "Knock-out" MUNA at club meetings and then sponsor the winning team to District MUNA.

The MUNA Committee formulates the topics for discussion, then selects up to 30 countries that are member states of the UN. These member states are then allotted to the selected school teams by ballot. Each team consists of up to three Year 11 students plus and a counsellor (Teacher or Rotarian).

Our senior school students will be our future leaders and we should be committed to helping to equip them for the future, in striving for greater tolerance in the world.

We seek your support to nominate and sponsor a school team at \$435.00 per team (\$405.00 before 1st April, 2019). This cost includes:

- Morning & afternoon tea and lunch for the participating students and their counsellor/teacher.
- Various prizes, for Best Dressed and Best Presentation.
- The cost of entering two District MUNA teams in the National MUNA to be held in Canberra in August of each year.

The letter will also include a copy of the resolutions to be debated and the amount of time for each resolution. You are encouraged to understand your "adopted" country's official position on a particular topic and present your arguments accordingly.

Three Teams will be sponsored by District 9675 to attend "National MUNA" in the Old Parliament House in Canberra in August of the same year.

Prizes will include:

- A perpetual award is presented to the student who delivered the best individual speech of the day as determined by the adjudicators.
- There will be a special prize for the best-dressed delegation, and we ask that you wear the national dress of the country that you are representing or at least items of clothing that clearly represent a particular country.

If you are having difficulty in determining a reasonable national dress, you are urged to contact the relevant Consulate or Embassy for advice. Tiaras, evening wear and a nation's sporting colours, by way of rugby shirts etc., are perfectly acceptable.

Please use your time well to prepare for Assembly Day; the adjudicators do not mark highly teams that merely stand up, read a prepared speech in a monotone and sit down again. The more that you research and understand the stance that "your" country would take on a particular topic the better you will be able to advance your country's point of view. Lively interaction is encouraged and we are hoping to allow more time for a right of reply.

Voting, when required, is carried out by one of the team members raising your country's name plate in the air.

The day is broken up as follows:

- Session 1 - Major Resolution 1 - all countries 3 minutes each.
- General Resolution 1 - all countries 1 minute each.
- Session 2 - Major Resolution 2 - all countries 3 minutes each.
- General Resolution 2 - all countries 1 minute each.
- Concluding Debate. During this final session of the Assembly debate countries wishing to exercise a right of reply on any topic discussed during this Model United Nations Assembly may, at the discretion of the Secretary General, be offered the opportunity of doing so.

*Participating countries are also invited to comment on the processes adopted for the Assembly and, as appropriate, offer suggestions for consideration by the Committee. As many countries as possible will be invited to contribute to the session. **Contributions will be limited to a maximum of one minute.***

The adjudicators prefer that each team member speaks rather than just the best speaker in a team. Also, the adjudicators do not look favourably on countries who have an adult writing their speeches for them on the day as a result of a speech by another country or as part of a right of reply.

Should you need any further assistance, please contact your nominating Rotary Club or send an e-mail to the MUNA committee for further information.

Would the Year 11 Co-ordinator please send an email to the MUNA committee giving the names of the students in your team, and the responsible adult who will be accompanying the students, as the committee would like to publish the team names in the programme on the day.

Also, each participating student will be presented with a personalized official delegate's certificate signed by the District 9675 Governor.

The sponsorship by your local Rotary club also includes the cost of morning tea, lunch and afternoon tea for the school's team and their responsible adult.
