WHO WE ARE

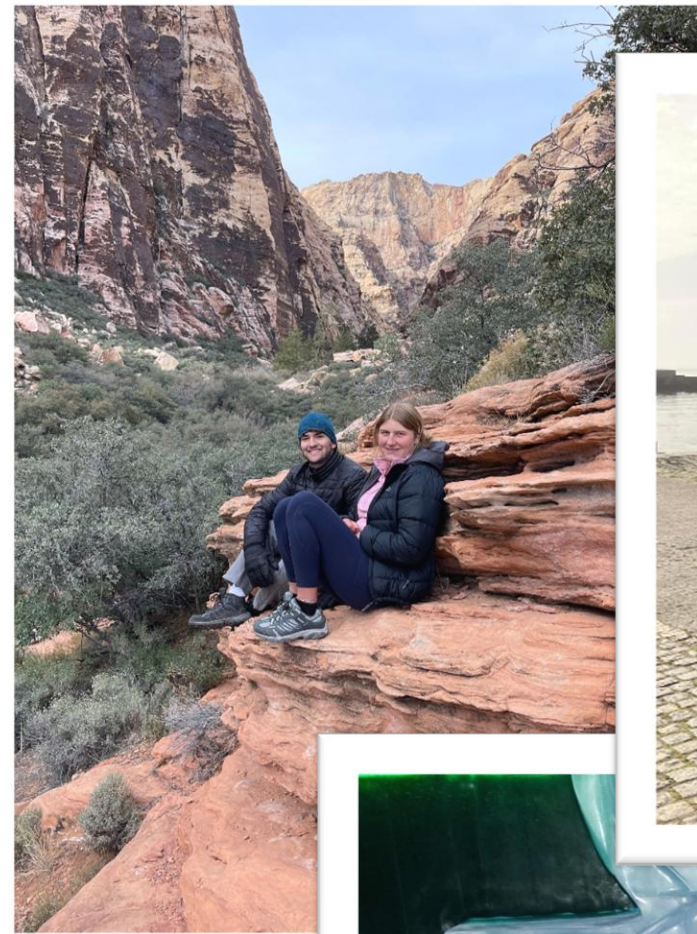
Rotary International is one of the world's most famous Humanitarian organisations.

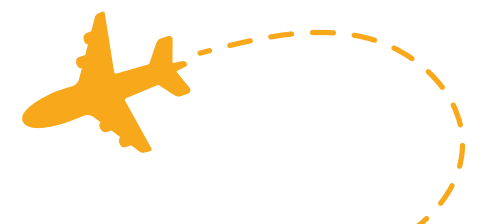

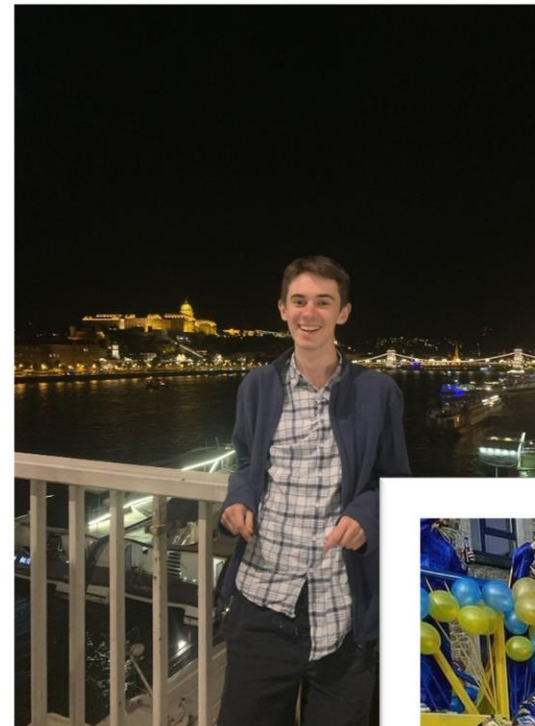

The offer

One year cultural immersion

Students have the opportunity to spend a whole year living overseas

Students live with 3 – 4 host families where they are expected to do normal chores. This gives them the opportunity to see different families and experience new opportunities!

Students must attend school – this is compulsory and a great way to meet local students and try new subjects/sports

Students meet a wide range of exchange students who often become lifelong friends

Most countries offer the opportunity for a 2-3week Summer Trip where students will visit major landmarks

Students are supported by Rotary in both NZ and their new country

The Costs

Our programme is run by volunteers throughout the world

The Costs continued

Our programme is run by volunteers throughout the world

Students receive a small monthly allowance from Rotary whilst overseas. Approximately \$100USD per month to purchase bus passes, cellphone data etc.

Rotary New Zealand will contribute towards their preparation and uniform

Students are expected to contribute towards their exchange – part-time job, chores etc.

There is some financial assistance via trusts available, but students need to apply themselves.

Whilst \$14,000 is an approximate, it's all dependent on the student and how they choose to live and what discretionary funding comes for the student's family..

In comparison, many other organisations do similar exchanges, and their costs are upwards of \$30,000.

Frequently asked questions

Departure

Students depart in January 2027 and return one year later,

No options for shorter exchanges

Students typically travel together and students going to Europe have a Rotary organised stopover.

Our Rotary travel agent organises all the flights and insurances. She also assists with the visa

Students must have full travel insurance, usually provided by Allianz that meets Rotary's requirements.



Frequently asked questions

Language, culture & country

Having a second language is advantageous, but not essential

Students must undertake self-directed study towards their new language

Students give us a preference of their chosen countries (we ask for the top 3) and we try to match their preferences, interests and personality. Preference is given to those with language skills for that country.

Most students (especially in Europe) will complete a language camp within a few weeks of arriving.



Frequently asked questions

Health & safety

Youth Protection is at the heart of our programme. All volunteers and host families must be Police Vetted

All volunteers must complete online learning modules to ensure the safety and care of our young people

Students have multi-layers of pastoral care to ensure they have support at all times

Majority of countries require students to be COVID vaccinated although this can change.

All students must be vaccinated against Polio.

There may be other vaccines required, which will be discussed with the student prior to departure.

Full medical insurance covers any Doctor's visits and accidents whilst overseas.



Frequently asked questions

Schooling



Students must attend and participate in local school – this is where they meet most of their friends!

Subjects do not cross-credit to any NZ qualification so a great opportunity to try a new subject.

Students usually go out in their Year 11, 12 or 13 year and either come back and repeat the year they've missed or skip a level. Many students use their Year 12 qualifications for University Entrance, and some take a bridging course at University if needed.

Frequently asked questions

Home hosting



As our programme is a reciprocal programme it is compulsory for families to host two inbound students for a period of four months and either host for a third period or find a local family that can

Home hosting is a great opportunity for the whole family to be involved, learning a new culture and understanding how our Kiwi students might be coping overseas

Home hosting allows for multi-cultural experiences and the opportunity to showcase NZ!

Host periods start in January of each year

Just like your student does not pay any board to live overseas, there is no financial reward for hosting



Frequently asked questions

Other



Parents are not allowed to visit their student whilst overseas. This has detrimental impact on the exchange, and some countries will terminate the exchange if this happens

We aim to send 7 – 12 students out each year but this may fluctuate. We assess each student on their own merits so if we need to increase our numbers we can do so

We are looking for students who are organised, good communicators and keen to say YES!

Update us

Send us your last school report or year results by end of November 2026



Selection

We will be in touch inviting students to a Selection Weekend where you will be interviewed and participate in group activities.

After that...

It's all go, go, GO!



Confirmation

We aim to be in touch with you by late June – mid July to confirm you've been accepted.



Introductions

We run a series of introductory sessions including a compulsory Orientation Weekend in August



Full Application

You complete a full application form which includes school reference, doctor's visit and dental check up!



Preparation

We work with you to prepare you for your amazing year overseas. Students need to learn their new language. There is another compulsory Māori immersion weekend.

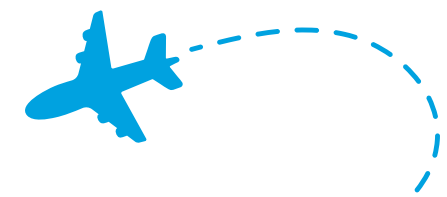
