

JOHN SCOTT - VOLUENTEERING IN SAMOA

John Scott spoke to us about his time volunteering in Samoa and the setting up of the Ramp-Up Ministries Trust.

John first went to Samoa in 2010 after the tsunami that devastated the southern coast of Samoa and over the last 8 years has returned 17 times. He describes himself as a 'Jack of all trades and master of not much'. However after listening to him speak, I doubt that there is any truth in the last part of that statement.

Through the St Albans Baptist Church that John is involved with, he joined the assistance effort run by Habitat for Humanity to help the people of Samoa. 30 people each week were sent over and often there were 60 people on site at any one time to help rebuild the villages.





Over the years he has been involved with building houses, closing up open buildings and building canoes. After the tsunami there was a need to repair and build more houses as well as the need for canoes to enable the people to go fishing again. 98 houses were built in 9 months.

John designed a canoe prototype using 2 sheets of plywood to include the traditional outrigger. He initially built two canoes while teaching the locals the necessary skills. This included a few days of Maths tuition, for example how to use a tape measure. They are now self-sufficient and can carry on with the task while teaching others. A construction course has also been run where many have learnt the skills of building construction to NZ standards.

John also spoke about the Ramp-Up Ministries Trust. The Trust looks for opportunities to give training to people to help them learn practical skills, promote self-confidence and develop a vision for themselves and their communities.

Thank you John for providing us with an insight into the work you and many others have completed, making a huge difference to the lives of many in Samoa.
