KEN BYE – COMMUNITY PATROL NEW ZEALAND.

Last week we heard from Ken Bye who is the chairman of Christchurch South Community Patrol, the area that is patrolled within his region is rather large, as it starts in Haswell and goes all the way through to Linwood, with the main catchment being Sydenham and Phillipstown.

Ken mentioned that all of the patrollers are specifically trained, not to engage with any crimes that are being committed (they are not the police) but to be obvious in the community and deter any potentially no-goods. While community patrol is not the police, they work closely together to high light areas that need extra patrol or to record any activity that seems out of the ordinary.

Ken used the latest hotspot maps to show the point raised above, he showed how areas in Linwood and Sydenham had been target and had heavy crime rates, community patrol uses this information to change their daily routes to have heavier coverage in these zones to be obvious in the community, one of their fundamental goals.

However, patrolling is not the one point of the community patrol, they are used as crowd control following the end of rugby games to assist in getting the crowd to keep moving and not pool in large number which heighten issue around confrontation.
