

#### SAVING LIVES EVERY DAY - NEW ZEALAND FLYING DOCTOR SERVICE

Our very own Club member, Graham Dockrill, ambassador and benefactor to the New Zealand Flying Doctor Service (NZFD), was instrumental in arranging for tonight's presentation by Kathryn Marshall, Development Director of the service ... "Kathryn is a highly experienced fundraiser with over 25 years in income generation, strategy and donor-centric communications [...] with world-leading hospitals, universities, and charities both in the UK and NZ."

The need for the flying doctor service might never touch our lives, viz,

- We are a flying intensive care unit with highly trained medical staff and specialist equipment
- Our patients receive a seamless level of care from bed to bed
- We operate 24/7 transfer services for
  - o critical care burn victims
  - o spinal injury patients
  - o neonatal transfers
  - o trauma victims
  - o surgery transfers
  - o organ delivery
  - blood and equipment supplies
- We save lives each and every day





It is a national service, providing critical care patient transfer services between hospitals. In 2020. It flew 1,212 missions with over 2,000 flight hours.

It was established 26 years ago to primarily support the medical services on the West Coast and other remote and isolated areas of the South Island. Unpredictable calls come in at the last minute. Children are much stressed, so family support them in their flights. We were graced with two anecdotal events. Many of the South Island medical services are remote and the distance is vast to access better medical services in the appropriate specialist hospitals. All medical transfers are critical.

An Intensive Care Consultant oversees all transfers and provides clinical support 24/7.

One of the first high profile missions was to transfer medical teams from Christchurch to Greymouth to assist staff at Greymouth Hospital following the Cave Creek disaster on 27 April 1995.

The Service's base is in Christchurch with 10 planes and there is a branch in Nelson with four planes. Specialist doctors are on-call. There are a total of 17 experienced nurses and four casual nurses who currently work in the Christchurch Hospital Intensive Care Unit (ICU) who are scheduled on a 24 hour roster as part of the Air Ambulance Retrieval Team. When required, a senior doctor can be drawn from the ICU to provide timely emergency care. The service also takes speciality staff on board such as paediatric doctors or midwives as required.

There is an annual funding shortfall of \$3m to sustain this critical air ambulance service. Pilot headsets alone, must be replaced every year and nurses' every two years. Our club, through the Community Service Committee's budget, has provided for this year with \$3,086.00 for headsets, one of pilot and 2 of nurses.

This 'air ambulance' service, works in harmony with the Westpac Rescue Helicopter Service. St John paramedics are also an important part of the team when a mission integrates with the rescue helicopters. Lacking the commercial profile of the helicopter service, the NZFD Service flies under the radar somewhat, most people not being aware that it exists.
