Bevan Killick—The Defence Employer Support Council (DESC) - Bridging the gap between the Defence Force and Civvy Street

Our speaker was Bevan Killick, Board Chairman of Defence Employer Support Council (DEFC). The Council was appointed by the Minister of Defence and is independent of the New Zealand Defence Force.

The mission statement is:

To increase awareness and engagement between New Zealand Defence Force, Civilian Employers and the wider Business Community.

The focus of the DESC is for members to use their knowledge, networks and experience to.:

- Engage with employers of Reserve Force members and NZ Cadet Force officers
- Open doors to civilian employment opportunities for members
- Foster relationships with employers to identify potential NZDF opportunities

Reservists are part-time members of the NZDF who, in addition to their civilian employment, have a parallel career as a member of the Army, Navy or Air Force. Reservists supplement the regular force and often bring specialist civilian skills in areas such as engineering, information and technology, and healthcare. They are a valued strategic asset and an integral part of the NZDF. The commitment of the reservists is 20 days per year.

The Limited Service Program is a 6 week program run in conjunction with NZ Police, Social Welfare and Work & Income. The program is targeted to 18 to 24 year olds and each course with an intake of 120 persons, costs \$1million. It provides a fresh start to increase competence and an understanding of what employers are look for. The transformation of the attendees is often remarkable, and when given a challenge, young people do respond.

A third facet of the DEFC, is Taskforce Kiwi, and is a voluntary program. The mission is:

To utilise the skills and experience of military and emergency services, and veterans to help communities across New Zealand to recover from natural disasters.

Taskforce Kiwi is not designed to be first responders but works alongside existing emergency management agencies and communities, providing skilled volunteer resources. It consists of defence and emergency service veterans and provides a sense of purpose, identity and community to those who have served our country and communities.

The benefits of the resources that DEFC have been able to supply, was highlighted during the Christchurch earthquakes, and overseas in the Haiti earthquake, and the Lismore floods in New South Wales.
