


AWARD WINNING AUTHOR AND ARTIST - GAVIN BISHOP

Greetings to Gavin Bishop, artist, illustrator and author, born Invercargill; childhood, Kingston; Honours degree in Painting (UC); teacher Linwood HS and Christ's College; a plethora of literary awards, ONZM, etc. etc.


Gavin acknowledged that today was 40 years to the day, since his first book was published - "Mrs McGinty and the Bizarre Club" - at a time when, there was little NZ literary content for NZ children and little by way of design available a la publishers who were pretty much degree- bound, not wanting to know about children related publishing. His second book, 'Bidi Bidi', was about sheep, written and illustrated with NZ toddlers in mind.

Gavin outlined his Whakapapa; that his parents had settled in Invercargill, starting their family. His father was entirely 'closed' regarding family background, even to the extent of not mentioning his 10 siblings in the North Island. Gavin eventually sorted his Whakapapa in Whakatane - a story in itself.

After publication of his "1950's Childhood'- a collection of memories of his childhood living in Kingston, as seen through the eyes of a very small child - Gavin became associated with two receptive publishers: - Wellington's Gecko Press with whom Gavin adapted European stories into 2 books totally in Maori with simple phrases and drawings; and Penguin Random House from which, a telephone call to write within a 64 page constraint, a NZ history covering the last millennium or so. The outcome: 'Aotearoa, The New Zealand Story'. ('Aotearoa')

'Aotearoa' starts back around the era of Gwandanaland with an asteroid hitting Mexico, engendering Earth's life mostly extinct, then, to begin again in the Pacific. So too, NZ wildlife. And so - continuing along lines of Maori myths and early stories of Polynesian settlement - starting with a nothing (total darkness), then to love-making and boundless copulation – (this is a children's book!) - between gods' Ranginui (Skyfather) and Papatūānuku (Earthmother).

Well you get the drift. Such were the joys that ventually 70 children were squashed into the sweaty darkness between boundlessly copulating parents. Seven of them were made gods, but, so trapped, were unable to perform their roles. But wait! - a spark of light under Papatūānuku's armpit, which son Tāne-mahuta, God of the Forests, gathers to grow with and push his father up into the heavens. And so there was life and sky and land and sea. Let there be all.

'Aotearoa's' mythical rendition was sourced and compiled by Gavin, from a collection of Iwi/Hapū variations of the one theme, and is beautifully and imaginatively illustrated. Surely Gavin's opus magnum!
