# Ogden's End Polio Now Campaign Adventure

Rotarians, Philip and Joyce Ogden, through support from the Public Image team have transformed a fundraising activity into a national campaign.



Philip and Joyce Ogden (both 72 years old) are pedalling from Perth to Adelaide to raise \$40,000 to help Rotary's worldwide fight against polio. Philip, a retired anaesthetist, and Joyce, a former counsellor with the Family Court, live in Launceston when not pedalling for charity.

There is a family connection to the disease of polio, but Mr Ogden failed to realise it until the eve of their departure from Perth. His older brother revealed that he had spent time in hospital as a boy suffering from the disease. Philip & Joyce, riding tandem, have covered 50,000 kilometres, including the famous desolate Nullabor Plain.

To date they have raised \$19.000.00 with their own Rotary club pledging \$5,000.00 and the District \$10,000.00 so they're not far off reaching their target.

Whilst media interest took a while to take notice, as time has gone on this has changed, with them even getting airtime on a South Australian radio station.

Well done to them for such a marathon effort!

### **CELEBRATING ONE MOTHER TO ANOTHER**

Several of our members are on the board of From One Mother To Another. Their hard work was recognised yesterday by the Ministry of Health - Manatū Hauora. Congratulations Team!

One Mother to Another was started in 2016 by two Christchurch mothers who experienced first hand how difficult it is to have a child in hospital. The pair decided they didn't want other mothers to feel so isolated and decided to make some gift bags with a message of encouragement. From humble beginnings the charity now supplies 270 gift bags a month to 7 wards in 4 South Island hospitals with a focus on neonatal units and Christchurch Hospital's Children's Acute Assessment Unit.
