Hoyts' Riccarton on Thursday 1st November commencing at 6.30 pm.

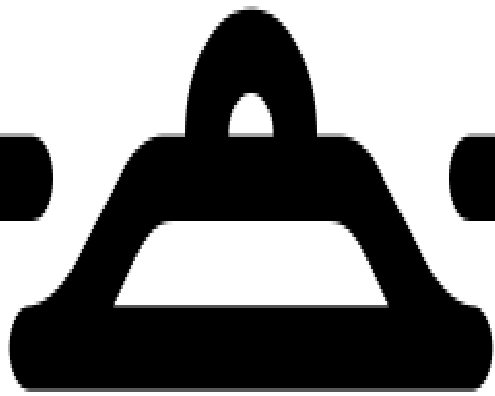

The Court's end of year production, Jesus Christ Superstar, is already fast becoming booked out, so we need to get our tickets now.

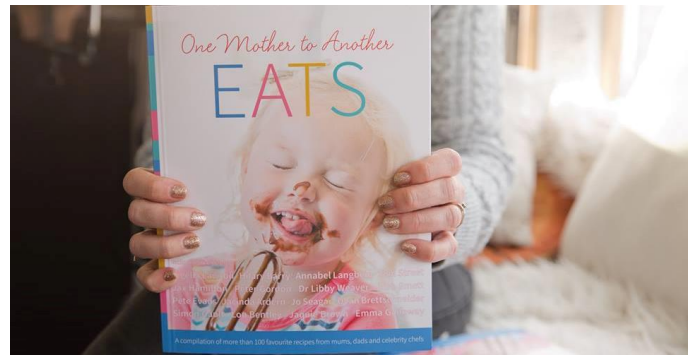
JESUS CHRIST SUPERSTAR
