

#### **RED CROSS IN KIRIBATI**

As well as having 18 people at the Cashmere Club for tonight's meeting, we enjoyed having two of our members as well as our speaker join us over Zoom. The speaker was Steve Manson a colleague of our President at the Department of Corrections. In a former life Steve was employed by the NZ Red Cross – he was involved in their response to both the Christchurch and Kaikoura earthquakes. He has also worked for them doing emergency response in various locations in the Pacific.

In 2019 he was living in Fiji as the Red Cross Operations Coordinator and in February/March of that year he was sent to Kiribati to assist with the recovery following a tropical depression weather system which affected the islands. Kiribati is a group of atolls north-east of Fiji near the equator. Most are very low lying being no more than 2-3m above sea level. The population is about 120,000 people about half of whom live on the coast at the south end of the main atoll Tarawa.



As well as a major threat from rising sea levels, Steve told us about the other significant environmental problems that Kiribati confronts. The foremost of these is the lack of any effective wastewater treatment which means that lagoon areas are severely polluted with human waste. The country imports a lot of processed food products which are often packaged in plastic. The upshot is that otherwise pristine beaches are covered with piles of plastic waste. This lies alongside the machinery waste that still litters the beaches following the battles fought there during the second world war.



Most Kiribati people live in "shacks" many of which were damaged by the tropical storm. Steve's job was to work with the local Red Cross volunteers to coordinate the clean-up and recovery. The storm damaged houses and also caused sea water to get into drinking-water wells. Livestock and crops were affected as well. Much of the recovery effort was funded by the NZ and Aus Red Cross organisations. At one stage Steve had to source gumboots for the local volunteers from Fiji because the locally available gumboots from China were too narrow for the Kiribati people. Mosquitos were a problem

causing dengue fever so nets were provided and education sessions run to help people learn how to avoid the various health hazards that surrounded them.

We all know about the Red Cross, but we are very grateful to Steve for his insights into how the organisation responded to assist a struggling country like Kiribati.
