Craig South: Architectural Trends & Award-Winning Designs

On Wednesday we heard from Craig South from South Architects talking to us about architectural trends within the industry currently. Craig talked about issues that were of current significance regarding urban density and building limitation within area of the city that are categorized as high density.

For context last month the Christchurch city council voted against accepting the central governments urban density plan. In areas of high density, we could see the rise of multistorey apartment complexes within a small, confined area with dwellings located a meter from the boundary fence. With any debate on such issues there is always a fine line on the fence (or lack of fence under the new directives) where people sit, around what they perceive to be acceptable living situations. But what was interesting to hear and something this reporter had failed to originally understand was how such utilities such as power and water would be impacted with such demand within a proximity. All this say is there is a lot more thinking that needs to go in the future planning of residential zones within Christchurch compared to what can already be seen occurring in the Auckland region

Craig also talked to us about some of the award-winning properties he has been involved with and how designs of houses change based on the brief of the client. Or as Craig described the story the client is trying to describe and what in a house they want to see.
