Tariq Habibyar: Mentors Across Borders—the evacuation of Afghan women and their families

Tariq Habibyar was born in Afghanistan during the war. Arriving as a refugee in New Zealand and having built a life for himself and his family here, he set his mind on helping uplift the lives of children and families back in Herat, his birthplace. – [From <u>Voices</u>, RNZ 18 May 2020]. His topic for tonight was "**Mentors across Borders** – **the evacuation of Afghan women and their families**". Suffice to say that "every single woman wants to leave, their freedom taken away by the Taliban".



Afghanistan has been conquered time and again - a very long

history dating back to Alexander the Great and beyond, and currently, the Taliban. The Taliban is a brutal, fundamentalist Islamic militia that, having taken Kabul in 1996, set up an Islamic government that held power over most of Afghanistan during the late 1990s.

The War in Afghanistan was from 2001 to 2021. The nearly 20-year-long conflict ultimately ended with the 2021 Taliban offensive, which overthrew the US and allies backed, Islamic Republic. The US withdrawal was on the back of governance agreements with the Taliban, agreements which have since crumbled. The problem in this, is that agreement talks were with the Taliban and not with the people. And so, it is now, back to the darkness of the '90's. Tariq has lost loved ones', brutally killed.

What is it, in particular, that holds the Taliban to persecute women? Tariq maintains that the Taliban fear women more than anything else; that men have guns/women have voices. For Afghanistan girls, it is a huge privilege to go to school and that the best fight-back is to invest in education. Tariq is dedicated to doing that. Tariq has six sisters all of whom he has taken out of Afghanistan. What might normally be a \$50 passport/visa charge becomes a \$5K to \$6K burden, but it can be done. With such privilege comes responsibility, especially towards the voiceless oppressed. Tariq sees a role for feminism as being the voice of the voiceless.

Tariq has a PhD in education at the University of Canterbury.
