- **PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN A HOST AND INTERNATIONAL ROTARY CLUB**
- **MINIMUM OF \$30,000. AVERAGE IS ABOUT \$56,000.**
- **WITHIN 7 AREAS OF FOCUS**
- **SUSTAINABLE**
- **HAS A START AND A FINISH.**

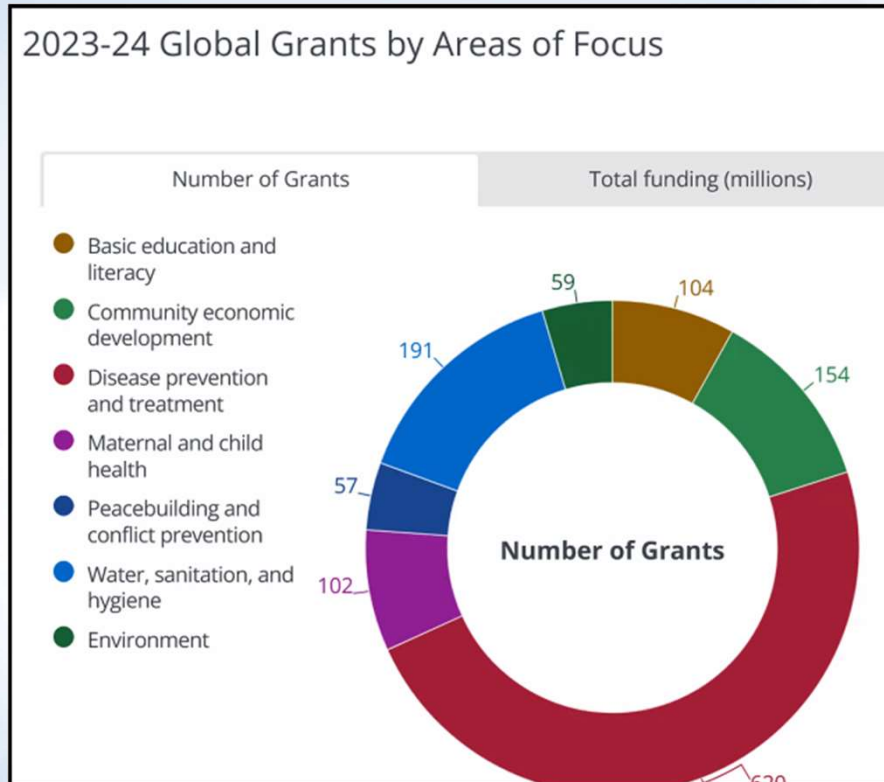

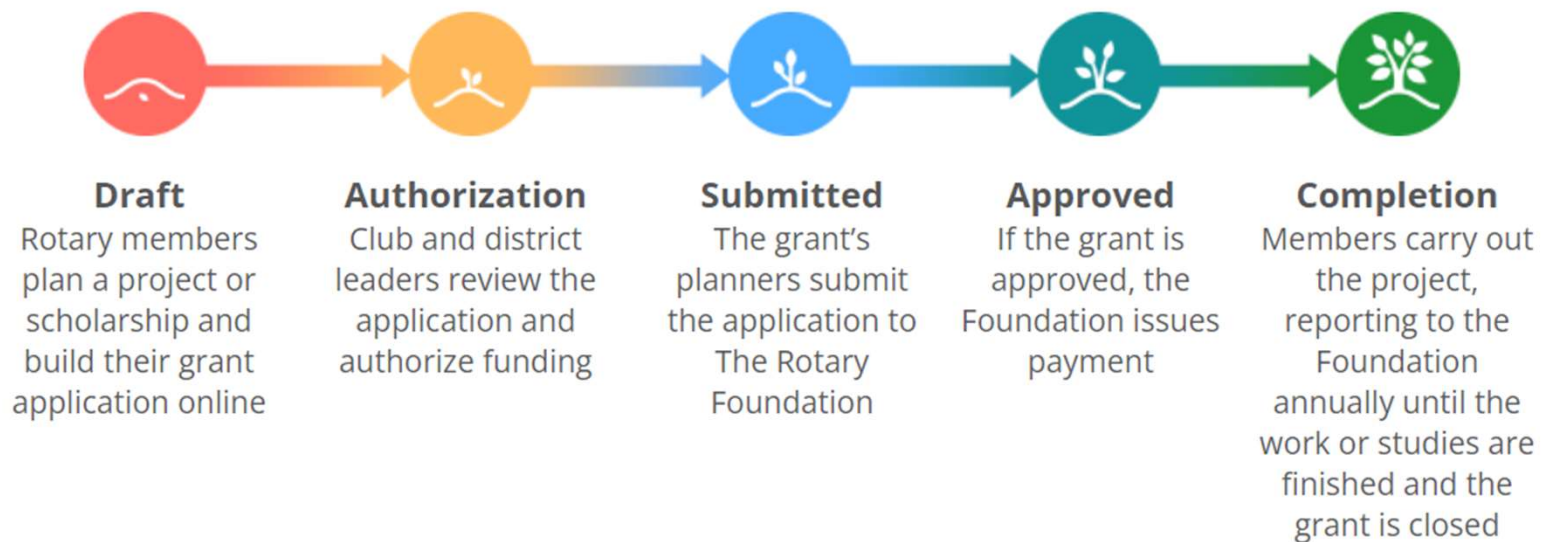

DEFINING THE PROJECT

- **COMMUNITY ASSESSMENT !!!!!**
- **LISTEN TO THE COMMUNITY**
- **START EARLY WITH THE APPLICATION**
- **ASK FOR HELP**
- **LOCAL RESOURCES**
- **CADRE**



Community Needs Assessment (NOT AN OPTION)

1

Choose a project that is based on the community's need

2

Assess resources of the community, your clubs and potential partners (local NGOs, Government agencies)

3

Talk to multiple levels of stakeholders in the community

4

Review and complete the Community Needs Assessment form (found on the District and Rotary International web sites).

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Project Planning

- Form a three-person grant committee from both Host and International Clubs
- Assign roles – get people with different skills
- Implementation plan (controls budget)
- Budget plan
- Contingency plan
- Document retention plan



Creating a Budget



- Promote strong partnerships between host and international grant sponsors
- Remind Rotarians and community members to set appropriate project objectives by first conducting a community assessment
- Encourage Rotarians to look for opportunities to partner with organizations or other Rotary clubs that are already working toward similar goals
- Recommend that Rotarians purchase equipment and technology from local sources whenever possible, to foster sustainability and contribute to the local economy
- Encourage Rotarians to explore the possibility of partnering with a cooperating organization that has demonstrated success in the relevant area of focus or project site

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Cash Guidelines

Cash contributions come from clubs and/or individual Rotarians

Funds cannot be raised from beneficiaries in exchange for a grant.

Funds cannot come from other grants.

Contributions credited to donor with IRD Donation Letter (Club foundation, District).



Request for DDF

Clubs must submit a ***Request for DDF Form***

DDF is allocation and is limited based on available funds.

DDF depends on availability of fund, your clubs qualification, scope of project, District Grant Committee and District Governor approval.



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Conflicts of Interest

Rotary wants both of the Clubs to disclose conflicts of interest

But the TRF understands the reality of the 3rd world.

In many 3rd world programs the Rotarians are also local business leaders – disclosure is not the same as prohibited.

3 bid for pricing is best practice but not practical in a remote village – just explain why your pricing is favorable – less transport costs, creates jobs and capacity building.



Summary of Successful Global Grant Projects

- Meet real community needs identified by community **assessment**
- Need careful **planning**
- Must be **sustainable** for global projects
- Requires proper **stewardship** of funds
- Have measurable **outcomes**

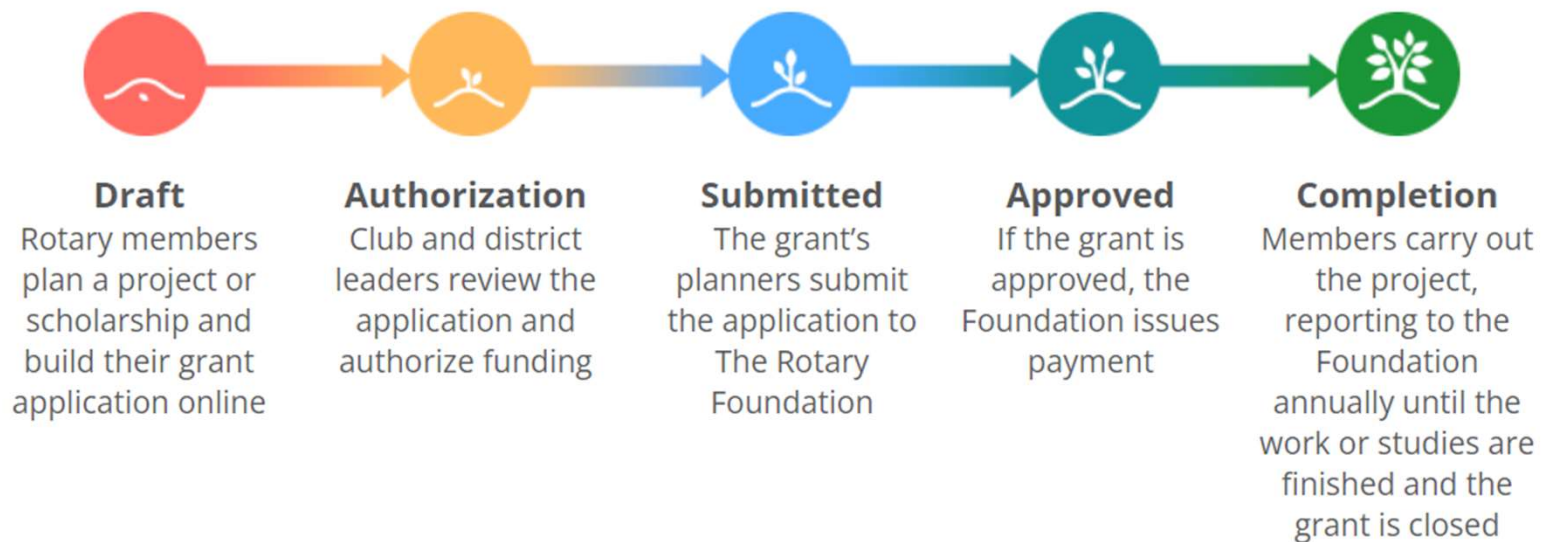

The Process for Global Grants

The lifecycle of a Rotary grant



TO BE APPROVED

- Is sustainable — include plans for long-term success after the global grant funds have been spent
- Includes measurable goals
- Aligns with one of Rotary's [areas of focus](#)
- Responds to real community needs — any club or district that applies for a global grant to support a humanitarian project or a vocational training team must conduct a [community assessment](#) first and design the project based on what they learn through that assessment.
- Actively involves Rotary and community members
- Meets the eligibility requirements in the grants [terms and conditions](#)

Submit for approval to TRF



Approval can take 6 months to a year – don't promise fast \$\$\$



Keep 'contributing' clubs informed of approval progress. Get written confirmation of their funds signed by President and President Elect (might take a year)



TRF may ask for clarifications or modifications



Upon approval, clubs listed for cash will receive TRF communication to send funds, but project sponsors are ultimately responsible for clubs to honor pledged contributions



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Financial Management Plan as required in M.O.U.



- Separate bank account for Global Grant funds (if allowed)
- Controls on Distribution of funds – 2 signatures
- Use checks/bank cards to track funds. Copy cash transaction receipts with cell phone.
- Detailed ledger (sent with reports)
- Include local laws



Record Keeping: Document Retention

KEEP THESE DOCUMENTS FOR YOUR RECORDS:

- ☐ All grant correspondence, including email
- ☐ Beneficiary documentation, including:
 - The community assessment
 - Any cooperating organization memoranda of understanding
 - Any additional agreements with beneficiary institutions or groups or implementing partners such as local municipalities or government agencies
- ☐ Vendor documentation, including:
 - Quotes
 - Contracts
- ☐ Grant-related documentation, including:
 - Scholarships and vocational training agreements
 - Receipts and invoices
 - Bank statements and other financial documentation
 - Inventory
 - Photos

Global Grant Reports to TRF

Progress reports

- 12 months following approval
- Every 12 months through the life of the grant

Final report within 2 months of completion

If there are questions, TRF can do an audit. Save files for five years.



Global Grant Report Content

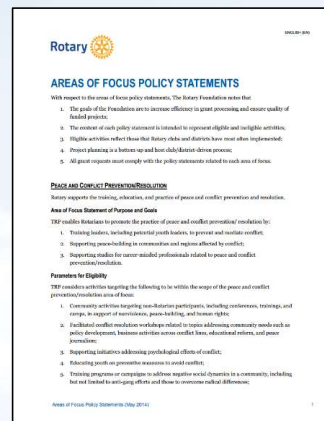
- How partners were involved

- Number of beneficiaries and how they benefited



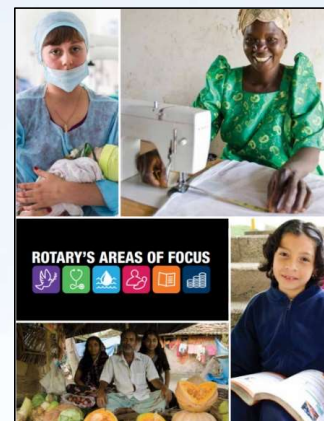

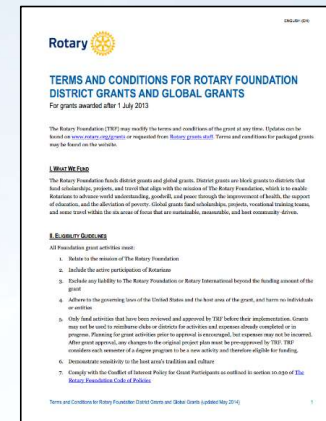
