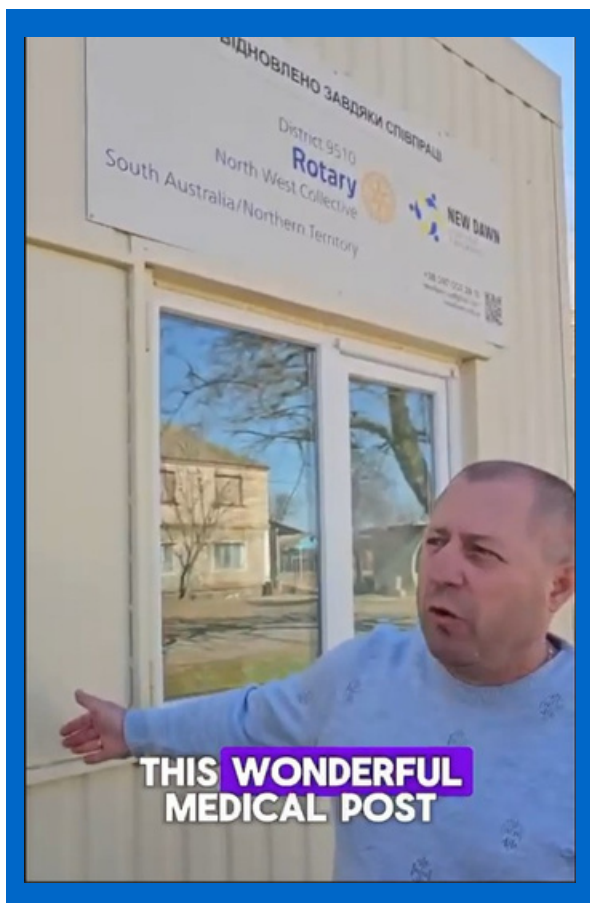

## Medical Centre Projects Update

The medical centre in Petropavlivka, funded by the Rotary clubs in the Rotary Community Group 2 from North-West South Australia and Alice Springs was officially opened 15 on March. The very harsh winter in Ukraine delayed the opening for over a month. We received a short video expressing heartfelt thanks from the community for their new facility. Mykola, who has been our Rotary Ukraine contact, was given leave from his military service to attend the opening. More photos from the opening on the next page

The final medical centre project is refurbishment of an existing building in Blahodatne. The community determined that this was a better option than providing a modular unit. New Dawn is currently carrying out building repairs and our project funding of \$24,000 will be used to renovate the main hall and a corridor of the building, provide a generator and fit out with furnishings and basic medical equipment. The community is contributing to the project through installation of a sewage system, renovation of the bomb shelter, installation of heating and a new entry canopy.

## Supporting Internally Displaced People in Odesa

Our project provided US\$10,000 (A\$14,285) to furnish 10 houses in a 'village' in Odesa to be used as temporary housing for people who have been evacuated from frontline areas.

This 'village' will provide safe, dignified and habitable conditions for people who have lost their homes and most of their personal belongings as a result of the conflict.

This project represents the essence of humanitarian support which is the aim of the Rotary-New Dawn Project.

- **Solar Power system to provide electricity security for Elderly Centre**

We are partnering with Rotary Ukraine (District 2232) to support an elderly centre which houses people who have been displaced from their homes due to the conflict.

Our part of a much larger project is to provide a new solar power system including batteries and installation. The cost of this project US\$6,500 (A\$9,300)
