- Decide on a **Youth Committee Initiative** if any
- **Consider Budget** – What can you afford? How can you raise the extra money?
- **Consider teaming up with other Clubs** to share costs or plan a Youth Initiative
- **Check the Program Dates** & insert on Calendar
- **Plan & Initiate advertising** for applicants
- **Plan for Youth Committee meetings**
- **Begin or add to Register of Sponsored Students**
- **Contact Club program committee re Youth Nights** for sponsored youth to speak to the Club
- Plan how you will provide **ongoing support** for sponsored youth (Alumni – Young Friends of Rotary)

EXPANDING THE NETWORK
