








RAWCS Vision

Drought Community Outreach Program (DCOP)



- Partnership with Drought Agency
- Community information days
- Rotary Clubs cater free + get \$1500 fee
- > Fully funded Community Service Project
- Eligible families receive \$500 vouchers
- 4 events: \$120,000 into local economies











Compassionate Grants (RACG)







185 grants approved so far 151 projects spent \$4.58M \$2.45:\$1 match ratio

Rotary Club + Community funds \$15K + \$15K grant = \$30K project

23 Rotary Clubs: average project \$73,630






