2024 ROTARY DISTRICT 9510 CONFERENCE - NOVEMBER UPDATE

As we approach the 2024 District Conference being held from 15th -17th March, in the beautiful town of Loxton, "By the River" – it is timely to update Members on where we are now, and where we need to be. This will be the final District Conference, as we move to Regionalisation. *Let's make it an Event to remember!* Please check the Conference Website for information using the following link -<u>https://2024loxton.au/</u>

<u>Registrations</u>: are continuing to grow steadily, which is pleasing, however it is important that Rotarians Register as early as possible, due to the demand on Accommodation, and to assist with planning activities, such as registration for the various events as places are limited, and numbers are increasing. To Register, simply click on the link, which takes you to the Webpage, click on Registration (in the Blue Header) and follow the prompts. Each item and event that you wish to register for is listed, with prices. Make your selection follow the prompts and once complete, you will receive a receipt

<u>Accommodation availability</u>: We have been receiving queries concerning accommodation bookings and/or availability for the Conference. This problem seems to have arisen due to <u>attempts to book on line</u> rather than contacting the Venue directly. After investigating the matter - it seems to be that where Venues are "have blocked out" rooms for Rotary – confusion arises if folks are not mentioning the Conference.

Having now investigated this with the venues listed below, I can confirm that a wide range of accommodation options are available in all Riverland towns, however, due to the number of major community (and private events such as weddings) taking place over the Conference weekend, not all properties are holding bookings specifically for the Rotary Conference. Some will hold until the end of this month.

<u>I encourage everyone to make their bookings as soon as possible, contacting the venues directly (see phone details listed below.</u> Using the following link <u>https://2024loxton.au/</u> which will bring up all the details of accommodation options. *I have listed currently available accommodation below- so get in early!*

Rotary clubs are encouraged to apply for funding for projects as per the following guidelines

- 1 The programme goal is to provide funding for educational purposes and associated supplies in developing countries as listed by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade
- 2 Funding will be used to facilitate Rotary Australia Overseas Aid Fund projects to assist in educational training
- 3 A maximum grant of \$5000 will be made available from the trust. Clubs are expected to contribute consistent with their size and ability to afford a contribution. A budget must be submitted for consideration that identifies the club's contribution.
- 4 The application must have a RAWCS project number and a partner club or district in the developing country. An MOU with an NGO in the target area where appropriate should be included. Multi-district or multi-country projects will be considered.
- 5 Applicants are encouraged to seek partners in other districts.
- 6 Applicants must demonstrate that the funding will contribute to the sustainability of the project.
- 7 All applications must be a project that fits with one of Rotary International's seven areas of focus.

SHELTERBAGS FOR THE HOMELESS SLEEPING ROUGH

Why Shelterbags?

- Increasing numbers of people, young and old, homeless and sleeping rough
- · Winter is obviously worst time of year bedding becomes wet and unusable
- Waste of donated resources blankets, sleeping bags
- Growing awareness in community of the homeless and their needs CEO Sleepout / Sunday Mail Annual Blanket Appeal / Red Shield
- Need for an **immediate solution** that offers shelter from the elements when sleeping rough

What are Shelterbags?



- A lightweight, waterproof, vented swag
- Includes mattress and padded hood
- Easy to carry when rolled up (backpack size and weight)
- Add sleeping bag or other bedding to suit seasonal conditions
- Keeps bedding dry, provides warmth, and some dignity

What is the cost?

- Currently \$85 per bag (includes shipping)
- Import them by the container load 900 bags through RC Terrigal

How are they distributed?

- MOU with RC Terrigal in place to supply bags to RC Gawler Light for further distribution to other RCs and organisations as needed
- Next container to be ordered by October 2023 ready for 2024 winter
- RC Gawler Light and partner clubs to purchase around 300 bags for distribution in District 9510
