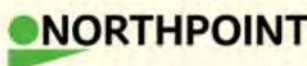

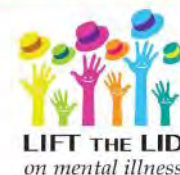

Two Special 7-day Challenge Sails

The **One and All** tall ship will be in Melbourne in May/June 2023 as part of the International Convention's activities. She will be taking Conference delegates on short lunch and dinner cruises on the Yarra from Docklands.

This offers the opportunity for approx. **40 students** aged **15-18** to help crew one of **two special 7-day Sailing Challenge voyages** from Adelaide to Melbourne and return. A representation of both South Australian and Victorian students will partake on each voyage.

Voyage 1 – Approx 20 students will be voyaging around the rugged SA/Vic coastline when the One & All departs Adelaide on Friday 19th May 2023 bound for Melbourne.

Voyage 2 – Approx 20 students will be voyaging back to Adelaide from Melbourne departing Sunday 4th June 2023.

These special voyages have already created a lot of interest so we urge clubs to inform us if they feel they may participate.

The total cost for each of these Special Voyages is **\$1,900pp**. It comprises

- The shipboard cost of the young people for seven days (instead of the normal five)
- Additional insurance and Melbourne Harbour costs for the *One & All*
- Interstate air fares and sundry accommodation and transport costs for interstate young people joining or returning from a special Challenge Sail.
- Melbourne/Adelaide airfares for volunteer crew joining or leaving the ship while she is in Melbourne.

If your club wishes to be involved

- Select (where possible, otherwise we can help) suitable students remembering we wish to have a wide variety of young people but particularly some who are in some way disadvantaged but show promise.
- Raise as much of the \$1,900 as possible by :
 - ⇒ the club contributing a minimum of \$1,200 (more if possible).
 - ⇒ have those parents who are able to contribute part of the cost.
 - ⇒ encourage individual club members who can to contribute.
 - ⇒ two clubs could combine to send a young person, contributing \$950 each.

We do not want any worthy disadvantaged young person to miss out, so if your club falls short of the total, contact us and we will see if commercial sponsorship may be available to assist in getting them aboard.
