In April 2021, ROTARIANS in Australia are hosting a fun, safe and virtual event that challenges you to walk, swim, or ride 4km on Malaria Awareness Day, 30 April, to represent the over 400,000 lives lost to malaria each year. You can sign up and donate

Each year, in the world more than 400,000 people die of malaria – a preventable and treatable disease. An estimated two thirds of deaths are among children under the age of five. By the end of this calendar year D9510, working in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Honiara and the Solomon Islands National Malaria Control Programme, will conduct household active case detection (ACD) in households in high transmission areas of Honiara.

The selected area of high transmission is along the Mataniko river in Honiara. Teams will be based at the Mataniko Clinic and will visit every household in defined areas. Rapid diagnostic tests (RDT) will be conducted for people who are showing symptoms of a fever. Treatments will be given to positive cases and they will be followed up. The overall objective is to reduce malaria by increasing the diagnosis and treatment of suspected malaria cases as part of an overall malaria control strategy.

OUTGROWER PROJECT, CAMBODIA

Raising income levels in rural communities through sustainable poultry microenterprises.

Rotary and Rotarians have so far committed to 3 Outgrowers - now we need urgent funding to reach our target of supporting 20 impoverished farmers in 2021.

OUTGROWER OBJECTIVES

Raise household income of rural poor through establishment of poultry small businesses.

Improve local poultry management through technical skills training.

Increase access to high quality protein & improve food security in rural poor communities.



The Outgrower project helps disadvantaged rural families.

Data collected from those same farmers after joining the project shows an earning potential of an additional 1,200 AUD per year over 4 chicken cycles - an increase to their annual household income of over 60%.

In real life terms, this could be the difference between their children going to school or not, or being able to pay for medical treatment if someone gets sick.

PROJECT STATUS

- **3** Outgrower farms established as result of Rotary & Rotarian efforts
- **17** Outgrower farms run by women identified for urgent 2021 funding
- 300 AUD average profit to the farmer per cycle

86% average survival rate of flocks to point-of-sale



FUNDING NEED

3,000 AUD gives a farmer the shed, equipment, chicks & training to start their own small business

The Peter Sutton Memorial Trust Fund

The Peter Sutton Memorial Trust Fund was established in 1986 to commemorate the late Rotarian Peter Sutton who was killed in an aeroplane crash whilst supporting the Rotary Foundation's Group Study Exchange program.

The Trust Fund provides for a broad cross-section of international students, selected through a Rotary International educational program, to visit Rotary District 9510, and to enable their participation and experience of an Australian rural lifestyle.

The trustees of the Fund apply basic criteria when assessing applications for funding:

- Is the international visitor(s) to Rotary District 9510 a participant in a Rotary International program?
- Is their program of an educational nature?
- How will their participation and experience of an Australian rural lifestyle contribute to their educational program?

The Trust Fund is an independent charity registered with the Australian Charities and not-for-profit Commission (ACNC). Rotary Clubs and individual Rotarians or businesses can donate to the Fund to ensure its sustainability.

1 YOUR GIFT WILL IMPROVE LIVES.

Today, 19 million people who would otherwise be paralyzed by polio are walking, and 1.5 million people who would otherwise have died are alive.

2 YOUR GIFT WILL INVEST IN THE FUTURE.

If all eradication efforts stopped today, within 10 years, polio could paralyze as many as 200,000 children each year. A polio-free world will be a healthier world for children everywhere.

3 YOUR GIFT WILL IMPROVE CHILD HEALTH.

Polio surveillance networks and vaccination campaigns also monitor children for other health problems, like vitamin deficiency and measles, so we can address them sooner.

4 YOUR GIFT WILL LOWER HEALTH CARE COSTS.

The global effort to eradicate polio has already saved more than \$27 billion in health care costs since 1988, and expects to save \$14 billion more by 2050.

5 YOUR GIFT WILL MAKE HISTORY.

Polio eradication will be one of history's greatest public health achievements, with polio following smallpox to become only the second human disease eradicated from the world.



At the end of the 1980s, more than 350,000 children were paralyzed by polio every year. Today, Rotary and its partners have reduced the incidence of polio by 99.9 percent. However, until we see the last of the poliovirus, eradication efforts need additional funding to:

IMPROVE

disease surveillance systems to detect any poliovirus in a person or the environment

HIRE

more than 150,000 health workers to go door to door to find every child
