
- 1.5 million ring pulls weighs about 421 kgs!

- 3,000 ring pulls less than 1 kg are needed to

make a pair of prosthetic legs!

FACTS ABOUT RING PULLS

They are sold to scrap metal merchants for aluminium scrap value.

Money is used to produce prosthetic limbs and wheelchairs, which are distributed free of charge.



Simple ring pulls from drink cans can be used to transform the lives of people who have suffered disfigurement, whatever the cause.

And the Scouts and Girl Guides still can collect the cans and make money for their projects!

Calperum: Time for Rotary Clubs to Re-engage

Calperum is undergoing a major transformation. An expanded focus on ecotourism with new accommodation is creating more opportunities for visitors to explore and enjoy the lands, creeks, lakes, and river, and learn about the special environment and aboriginal culture.

Calperum is also expanding its education offerings in stem programs, international programs, school programs, and indigenous programs.

Rotary's involvement with Calperum has been a major effort over the past decade with over 30 clubs assisting in many ways such as environmental monitoring, tree planting, the clearance old fences, and handyman jobs.



Now is the time for clubs to re-engage as Calperum will need continuing assistance during this transformation. Assistance will be required for:

- Creating bush gardens and revegetation around the four accommodation buildings currently being upgraded by Rotary clubs.
- Installation of a reliable internet service to all buildings,
- Provision of solar power to buildings planned for the near future to assist with cost savings and enable an environmentally friendly solution.

Financial assistance is needed for both the internet and solar power initiatives and any contributions by clubs would be much appreciated.

Responding to the Ukraine crisis



The Rotary Foundation has launched a *worldwide appeal* to support the Ukrainian people affected by the current fighting in their country.

From now until 30 April 2022, all donations to the Foundation's *Disaster Response Fund* will be made available to the Rotary District in Ukraine and to designated Rotary Districts bordering Ukraine sheltering refugees from the war-torn country. From now until 30 June 2022 those Rotary Districts will be able to access this Fund to apply for *disaster response grants* to purchase items such as water, food, shelter, medicine and clothing.

The first Rotary club was established in Ukraine in 1929. During and after WW2, Rotary International made a decision to suspend Rotary activity in the Ukrainian Occupied Territories. The first postwar Rotary club was established in Kyiz in 1991 and Rotary has grown throughout the country since then. Rotary is also well-established in neighbouring countries particularly in Poland where many refugees have fled. In 2021 local Rotary clubs established a *Rotary Peace Square* in Kyiv.

Rotary volunteers on the ground in Ukraine and these neighbouring countries will be able to use the funds raised to help the suffering Ukrainian people.


