FROM YOUR DISTRICT PROTECTION OFFICER

The D9510 Master Protection Policy applies to Rotary Programs involving youth or vulnerable adults.

These programs are those which are sponsored, instituted, structured, organized and run by RI, District or Clubs and for which Rotary bears legal responsibility, such as RYLA and RYPEN. (MPP 2.1) The Policy does not apply to programs run by other organizations in which Rotarians may be involved. In that case the regulations or requirements of the sponsoring organization in relation to youth protection will apply.

Rotarians who are or intend to be involved in non-Rotary community youth/activity programs for which the sponsoring/organizing authority requires either a Working with Children Check (WWCC) or any other clearances are encouraged to clarify and complete those requirements in concert with the sponsoring authority.

However, Rotary Clubs may think it prudent to encourage or recommend that members obtain WWCchecks in anticipation of voluntary work with other organizations, specially if that engagement will in any way be associated with an individual's membership of Rotary.

This does not mean that all Rotarians have to obtain WWC Checks, but that only those who wish or intend to be involved with youth programs are encouraged to obtain their WWCC.

The WWCC is free but District is keen to not overload the system by requesting checks that are not going to be used. Rotarians requiring a WWCC should visit the DHS website which provides all the detail for understanding and obtaining a WWCC. Members are able and encouraged to individually obtain and take responsibility for maintaining their own WWC Check.



Two special Interstate Youth Challenge Sails

The One & All tall ship will be in Melbourne in May/June 2023 officially as part of the Rotary International World Convention. She will be taking Conference delegates on short cruises on the Yarra from Docklands.

She is also offering the opportunity to young people to set sail for one of two seven day voyages.

The <u>first</u> 7-day Sailing Challenge will be voyaging around the rugged SA/Vic coastline when the One & All departs **Adelaide** on **Friday 26th May 2023** bound for Melbourne .The <u>second</u> 7-day Sailing Challenge will be returning to Adelaide, departing **Melbourne** on **Sunday 4th June 2023**.

South Australian and Victorian young people will be involved in both of these voyages.

These special voyages have already created a lot of interest so we would urge clubs to inform us if they feel they may want to participate. The total cost of these Special Voyages is **\$1,900pp**. It comprises:

- the shipboard cost of the young people for seven days
- additional insurance and Melbourne Harbour costs for the One & All
- interstate air fares and sundry accommodation and transport costs for interstate young people joining or returning from a Challenge Sail.

We are expecting commercial sponsorship will cover some of these costs particularly for disadvantaged students but would ask clubs to select (where possible, otherwise we can help) suitable students remembering we wish to have a wide variety of young people including young people who are considered disadvantaged.

We hope that clubs will raise as much of the \$1,900 as possible with a minimum of \$1,100. There is an opportunity for clubs to share the cost. (We would hate to see a disadvantaged young person miss out, so if your club falls short of the total, contact us and we will see if commercial sponsorship may be able to assist in getting them aboard.)



The NYSF Year 12 Program has run for over 38 years and is one of the best-known science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) experiences in Australia for young people. It has helped over 13,000 + alumni realise life-long STEM literacy.

This youth-led, program gives students a broad understanding of the diverse study and career options available in STEM. Students visit world-class facilities, participate in hands-on workshops and meet Australia's leaders in STEM.
