From your District Protection Officer

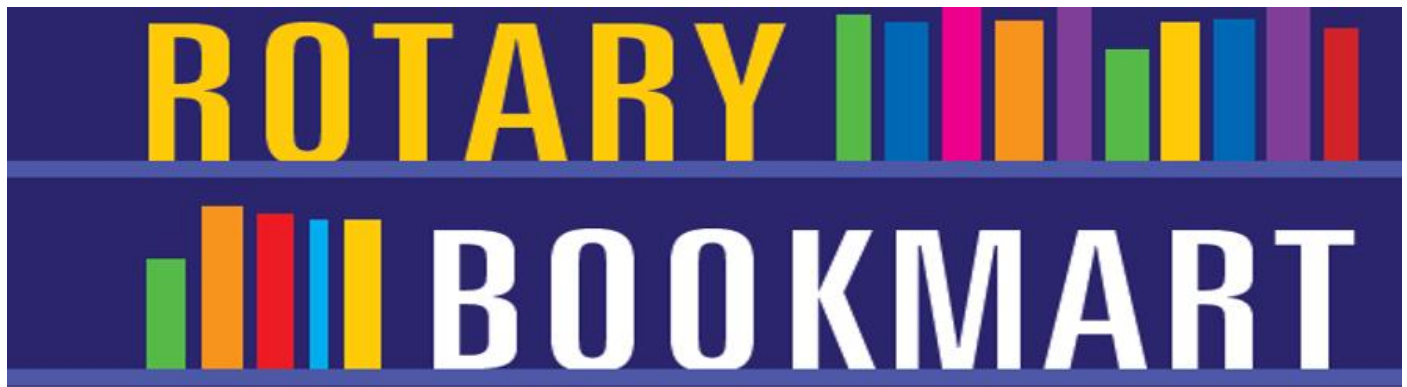
The D9510 Master Protection Policy **applies to Rotary Programs involving youth or vulnerable adults.** (MPP 2.1)

It does not apply to programs run by other organizations in which Rotarians may be involved. In that case the regulations or requirements of the sponsoring organization in relation to youth protection will apply.

Rotarians who are or intend to be involved in **non-Rotary youth and support programs** for which the sponsoring/organizing authority requires either a WWC or any other clearances are encouraged to clarify and complete those requirements in concert with the sponsoring authority.

However, if Rotarians or Rotary Clubs see fit to obtain WWC checks in anticipation of voluntary work with other organizations, then they should visit the [DHS website](#) which provides all the detail for understanding and obtaining a WWCC.

During the 2-day workshop you will discover the strategies and tools that can help Rotarians and Rotaractors like yourselves to build and sustain peace.

You'll be provided with an understanding of the Pillars of Positive Peace and be **empowered to go back to your clubs and communities as agents of change.**

The emphasis of the workshop is real actions, led by participants. You will be taken on a pathway of discovery of IEP research, using the research to develop real and practical projects, and how to implement them. There will be a strong focus on interactive activities that emphasis peer to peer learning and encourage everyone to engage. As a result of participating in the workshop, participants will have the information and understanding to activate Positive Peace in their clubs and communities.

Nomiki is 13 years old and as part of her school's Year 7 curriculum in 2021, children were required to complete a Personal Project. Nomiki always had a passion for writing and she decided that for her Personal Project she wanted to write and publish a book and donate part of the proceeds of the small number of copies she printed, to the Indigenous Literacy Foundation.

After a lot of research, interviews with other authors, a publisher and 9 months of hard work, Nomiki wrote and published her book. Her book is titled '**Goodbye**' and it is the story of a young girl called Anna who was told that her father had died, but little did she know that this wasn't the case. The story unfolds when she opens a letter and what she is about to uncover changes her life.

Nomiki received full marks for her project and very positive feedback for her book. This has encouraged

her to be wanting to continue with her fundraising efforts for this wonderful cause, create awareness and hopes to inspire other young people to follow their dreams, as well as helping others. To date Nomiki has donated \$435 to the Indigenous Literacy Foundation, from the sale of her book. Her book is currently available for sale through the Dillons bookstore, in Norwood.

100 PEACE POLES ~ 100 YEARS OF ROTARY IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA



Rotary and Rotaract Clubs from across South Australia and District 9510 are invited to become involved in this Centenary of Rotary in South Australia (2023-24) project.

The aim is to distribute 100 Peace Poles for the 100 years of Rotary in South Australia. The poles will be sponsored by Rotary Clubs, individuals and businesses, with each pole numbered 1 to 100. The poles can be donated to schools, community groups or organisations of your club's choice.

Peace Poles are set into the earth, with the Universal Peace Message 'May Peace Prevail on Earth' in various languages, one on each of the pole's four sides. The Rotary SA centenary logo and your club's name is also included.

The poles symbolise Rotary's common wish for a world at peace and stand as a silent vigil, reminding us to think and act in the spirit of peace. There are over 250,000 peace poles around the world already.

In Australia, the Rotary Peace Pole project began with an idea of the Rotary Club of Canberra Burley Griffin to celebrate the centenary of Rotary in Australia in 2020-21. The Rotary Club of Adelaide (a Rotary Peacebuilder Club) is expanding on this initiative to celebrate the 100 years of Rotary in South Australia. Importantly the aim is help spread the message of peace and connect Rotary clubs with community.

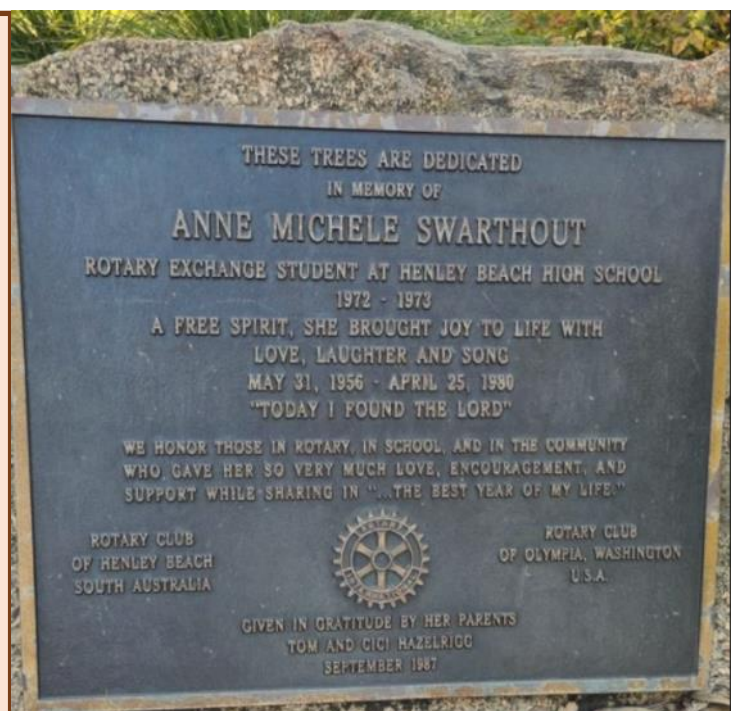

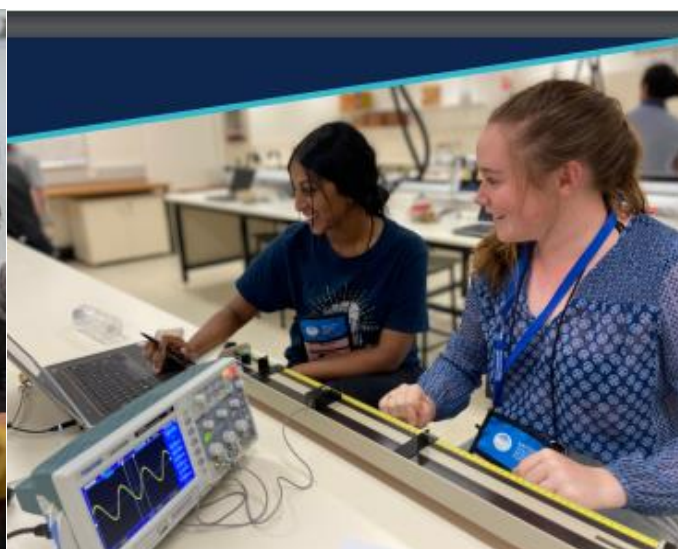

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The NYSF Year 12 Program has run for over 38 years and is one of the best-known science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) experiences in Australia for young people. It has helped over 13,000 + alumni realise life-long STEM literacy.

This youth-led, program gives students a broad understanding of the diverse study and career options available in STEM. Students visit world-class facilities, participate in hands-on workshops and meet Australia's leaders in STEM.

It is a chance to think about the future of STEM and how a new generation of scientists can make an impact on the world for the better."
